APA MILE HIGH FALL TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS

The APA Mile High 8-Ball, 9-Ball and Ladies Team Championships were held January 30th and 31st at Greenfields in Lakewood. A total of 37 teams competed for trophies, cash and bragging rights as best team of the fall session.

Nineteen teams competed in open 8-ball with many close matches. After a grueling two days of close play, the finalists were POOLOSOPHY and GLAD-E-8'ERS, both out of Zoosters. GLAD-E-8'ERS jumped out to a two match to none lead. POOLOSO-PHY did not give up and won the next match to close the score to 2-1. In the fourth match, Nancy Balasbough prevailed over Keith Colligan 2-0 to clinch the win and \$1,000 first prize. POOLOSO-PHY claimed second place and \$750.

Sixteen teams vied for the top spot in team 9-ball. The final between OOPS WRONG HOLE from Fox and Hound and MISSFITS from Zoosters was a one sided affair with OOPS WRONG HOLE needing only 4 matches to win. Mario Castro was the star, winning the opening match 18-2. First place money was \$1,000 with the MISSFITS taking \$750 for their great play.

The Ladies Division final pitted CATASTROPHES from Park Centre and ROPED INTO IT from Holiday Bowl. This matched proved to be the most exciting of the weekend with CASTROPHES jumping out to a 2-1 lead. In the key fourth match Joelene Nelson upset Cindy Quintana 2-1 to take the team match to double hill. Chris Honeman bested Shelly Goldman in the final. ROPED INTO IT was rewarded with first place price money of \$1,000 with CASTROPHES earning \$750.





Avoiding Scratches

March 2010

For me the best thing about pool is the fact that the learning never ends. And after spending most of last spring and summer filming the *Video Encyclopedia of Pool Shots* with Dr. Dave Alciatore, I learned a lot, especially in light of all the years I've played and taught pool. Our work culminated in the most comprehensive collection of pool shots ever published, spanning five DVD's of nothing but shots and explanations from the most basic to the very advanced. Last month I presented a simple but powerful technique I learned from Dr. Dave for predicting the cue ball's path for many shots and will continue now with more examples of that technique's usefulness.


Last month we learned that for cut angles ranging from a quarter-ball hit to a three-quarter-ball hit, a naturally rolling cue ball will deflect away from the path it takes to the object ball at an average angle of 30 degrees. The overall range from minimum to maximum deflection is narrow enough to use 30 degrees as a

reliable indicator for the cue ball's path after its collision with the object ball. Then we learned to apply Dr. Dave's famous peace-sign technique to predict the cue ball's path. It turns out that, for most of us, a relaxed

peace sign makes a 30-degree angle and you can check yours with a drafting triangle. Or you can visit Dr. Dave's site where he has a template you can download and print for that purpose. You can find the URL at the end of this article.

Last month we applied the peace-sign method to a couple of shots in order to predict and execute accurate position play. Now we can apply it in another way to determine shot selection. In the diagram we see an 8-Ball situation with only two stripes remaining before the 8 ball. Initially most players would lean toward shot A first, mainly because it's closer to the cue ball than shot B, something we learn to prefer early in our learning. And we would look at shooting that ball into pocket X. But that looks a little dangerous.

Dave Hughes (Denver, CO) challenged Ed Borrego for the B-side finals, but Borrego ousted Hughes 5-2 for a second chance at Cordova in the title match. Sam Cordova left no doubt that he was top dog on this day, as he turned back Ed Borrego by a 5-1 margin in the first set for the title!

Fisher and Reyes named Players of the Decade

Efren "The Magician" Reyes, who amassed nearly \$1.7 million in prize money, and Allison Fisher, who won 27 Women's Professional Billiard Association Classic Tour titles, were named Player of the Decade by the United States Billiard Media Association, the USBMA announced today.





Reyes, the 55-year-old Filipino sensation, won more than 20 major men's professional pool titles during the decade, starting with his \$30,000 Camel Pro 8-Ball Champ-

ionship win in 2000. Of his 22 major victories, the versatile Reyes won four one-pocket crowns, four 8-ball titles and 14 9-ball titles. He also won the Derby City All-Around title three times.

But it was during the short-lived International Pool Tour that Reyes scored his biggest wins. In three multi-million dollar events, Reyes won two titles (2005 IPT King of the Hill and 2006 IPT North American Open) and pocketed \$765,000. Fisher, meanwhile, continued her dominance over women's pool for a second straight decade. After winning 26 Classic Tour titles during the '90s, the former snooker champion added 27 more from 2000-2010. In addition to her WPBA Classic Tour titles, Fisher, 41, earned the gold medal at the 2009 World Games, was the 2000 BCA U.S. Open 14.1 champion and won the Tournament of Champions five

times. She earned \$637,000 over the 10-year span.



Additionally, both Reyes and Fisher were elected into the Billiard Congress of America Hall of Fame during the decade, with Reyes being inducted in 2003 and Fisher in 2009.

In Player of the Decade voting, Reyes out-pointed Johnny Archer, Mika Immonen and Ralf Souquet. Fisher was named woman player of the decade on all but two ballots, with Karen Corr and Jasmin Ouschan each receiving one vote.





"Yep. But I was struggling mightily not to say the first thing that came to mind after she said this was the first time she ever beat me."


"What was that?"

Like Music to my Ears

As you read these words, think of your favorite song. Now, close your eyes for a moment and relish that melody you love so much. Is it a love song or a rock or classical

piece? It doesn't matter. Just feel it and really listen to it in your mind. As it gets to your favorite part, think about all the individual pieces coming together to make this song so perfect.

Can you hear the steady drumbeat building up to a thrilling crescendo? Don't forget the hot guitar lick that jumps in just at the right moment. Now, listen for the ominous strings creeping in for that haunting touch. Oh, and what about the vocals? Could you imagine a better person belting out such tender lyrics? All of these elements combined are what make your favorite song so brilliant. All those little touches together are what made you take the needle back over and over again until your parents eventually hid the record from you.

Now, let's dissect all these individual moving parts and relate them to our pool mechanics. The anatomy of a song consists of these main parts: verses, the refrain, and the chorus.

The verses tell the story. They set the tone for the whole song and precede the refrain and chorus. Think of the verses as our bridge, stance, and warm-up strokes. Determine where you are aiming and check your tip position for the spin you'll be applying. Each verse may vary slightly based on the situation. The verse is building up for the chorus to come by establishing our alignment and preparing to pull the trigger.

Next is the refrain which is just a couple repeated lines at the end of each verse which lead up to the chorus. The refrain would be that final breath you take as you complete your warm-up strokes and refocus your eyes back to that spot on the object ball again. If you study the pros, their refrain is very distinct. You can always tell when they're about to pull the trigger. They complete their warm-up strokes, everything comes together, they cue right up to the cue ball, and fire.

When you're ready to pull the trigger, this is the chorus we've been waiting for. The chorus is where the main theme and often the title are expressed in a song. It's the melody that we're humming for days after we hear a song that we like. Typically, it completes the song. Your verses and refrain lead you to this moment. Make your chorus count. Bring that stroke back smoothly and with control. Sing a chorus that you will want to remember and repeat.

Though your verses may vary based on what the shot requires, your refrain and chorus come together to make the shot. Of course, there are extra parts to the anatomy of a song and to our pool game. However, just like a beautiful piece of music, your pool game can't come together without each of these integral parts. Develop and strengthen all of them and play your favorite song at the table.



2009 Players of the Year are Announced ~ Jasmine Ouschan and Mika Immonen ~

The WPBA has a new superstar and her flowery name belies the explosive power she brings to the table. Jasmin Ouschan let her cannon break shot lead her to capture three of the five WPBA Classic Tour events in 2009 and with that earned her Player of the Year status over runner-up

Ga Young Kim. While Kim also had an outstanding year, it was Ouschan's three WPBA Classic Tour wins that cemented her position as the 2009 Player of the Year.

Jasmin took her first WPBA win of the year at the Great Lakes Classic. Her next two finals resulted in wins over the same player, Xiaotang Pan. Ouschan defeated Pan 7-5 to win the Pacific Coast Classic and then beat her 7-2 to win the Tour Championship. Jasmin also scored top 10 finishes at both the WPBA US Open and the Colorado Classic. Notable international finishes this year included a third at the Women's World Ten Ball Championship and a fifth at the China Open Women's Division.

Ouschan is a great addition to the WPBA lineup of stars. She is fan-friendly and the fans have fallen behind her in droves. But as outgoing as she is off of the table, she is tremendously focused while playing and has an innate ability to live within the rails while in competition. She is as focused as any

player has ever been and her concentration allows her to be deadly and consistent.

She also has a coach, Michael Neuman, who keeps her nose to the grindstone. Al-

ways studying her game while she is playing, Michael helps Jasmin discover and work off any weaknesses that may creep into her game. And that is one of the secrets to her success. Jasmin in no way feels that she is at the top of her game. She feels she still has a lot of improving to do and she labors long and hard to make those improvements. She plays in a lot of men's events, where she has taken down World Champions on multiple occasions. She says she really enjoys competing against the guys because: "They play at a bit of a higher level. It really sharpens you up." Ouschan is aggressive and runs headlong into any challenge she can find. Her will to win is fueled by big games and big name opponents.

AZBilliards wishes all the best to Ms. Ouschan and congratulates her on her first Player of the Year title. We have enjoyed watching her progress from a dedicated teenager to a true professional and we look forward to covering her exploits for many years to come.

With his winnings for 2009 hovering around the \$250,000 mark it comes as no surprise that Mika Immonen is the AZBilliards Player of the Year. His year has been nothing short of incredible. The two events that brought him greatest recognition are the US Open, where he won his second consecutive title, and the World Ten Ball Championships, where he won his second World Title of the decade.

But let us not forget, he also won the \$25,000 Challenge of Champions, two Joss Tour stops, three Predator stops, the Blackpool Open, the \$40,000 Qatar International, the Mezz Classic, and the World Classic 10-Ball in Galveston. You might say this has been his year.

A truly remarkable achievement for the vear was his second consecutive win at the US Open. This is a nearly impossible feat and Mika is only the second man in history (Nick Varner is the other) to have accomplished it. The over-200 man fields make for a tough run for anyone and Mika made the majority of his run this year through the one-loss side. After besting Jerry Fitchett in the opening match he fell to Chris Bartram in the second round and then had to beat 9 players running before he got his revenge on Bartram and knocked him out of the tournaments 11-6 to graduate into the finals chart. To top it off, he had to get past a very determined Ralf Souquet in the finals, which he did with some very convincing cuemanship 13-10.

Immonen began the year as the man to beat. He came into 2009 as the defending US Open Champions and a member of the winning Mosconi Cup team, helping



Europe claim the cup in Malta. His quiet, low-key attitude often put opponents off. Time after time Mika would massage table layouts into surrender and gain big leads on impressive opponents, leads so large that they just could not make the comeback effort. Immonen controls the table. If he cannot make a shot, or if making the shot carries no positional advantage, he is very adept at putting people behind bars with safety play that is downright devastating. Players who engage him in safety wars rarely win. Even if they manage to put him in trouble his kicking skills are more than capable of firing right back at the aggressors.

Immonen has been nothing if not consistent. He has been at the top of his game for at least the last three years, something that most players (who tend to run hot and cold) simply cannot pull off. And there is the continuing danger for all who face him. Immonen is still young and aggressive. His eyes are still razor-sharp and he has immense confidence in his arm and his judgment. He is in no way ready to settle down or rest on his laurels. He is working out and practicing just as hard as ever. As large a force as he was in 2009, he could be even more dangerous in 2010.

Scholarship Opportunities for High School Seniors

The **Billiard Education Foundation (BEF)** is pleased to announce that they are accepting applications for the 2010 scholarship awards. The **BEF Academic Scholarship Program** is administered annually under the direction and guidance of the BEF Board of Trustees. Applications must be postmarked no later than April 1, 2010 and can be downloaded by going to the BEF website at: www.BilliardEducation.org.

The BEF Academic Scholarship Program is divided into two categories: Excellence in Education scholarship (one \$5,000 scholarship awarded over a two-year term) and Aiming for Higher Education scholarships (seven individual scholarships at \$1,000 each). The objective of the BEF Academic Scholarship

Program is to grant scholarships to high school seniors who have benefited from the sport of billiards and are pursuing a college education.

Prospects must adhere to the following scholarship criteria: 1) hold a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA (on a 4.0 scale); 2) must have an ACT score of at least 23 or SAT combined score (critical reading + math) of 1050 or higher; 3) submit a 500-1000 word essay on how billiards has been an integral part of their life; 4) must be accepted to an accredited undergraduate academic program by June 1, 2010; 5) must attend an accredited undergraduate institution and carry at least 12 hours per semester.

The final application must also include a letter from the applicant outlining academic achievements, leadership and/or community service work, a description of the applicant's background and career objectives, personal and professional (academic) goals. Applicants must also submit an official High School Transcript and SAT/ACT scores.

So we examine the outcome by placing the peace sign as shown with the index finger on the line that the cue ball takes to the object ball and the point where our fingers would meet over the spot where the cue ball's center will be at contact. Sure enough a quick peace-sign check tells us that a rolling cue ball will scratch in pocket Y. So then we decide to shoot the stripe into pocket Y, but that one looks a little scary too. Once again the peace sign reveals that shot will lead to a scratch in pocket X with a rolling cue ball. We can avoid both scratches with stun or draw but either one of those choices will send the cue ball to the side rail and keep it at that same end of the table, far from the next shot.

The only way to get position for the next ball from ball A is to shoot it into pocket X with draw and inside english to move it three rails around the table for a shot on the next stripe. That's possible but quite difficult, in terms of both pocketing the ball and controlling the cue ball.

After seeing no future in shot A it's time to turn our attention to shot B. Though it's a little farther away it turns out as the better shot to play first. To make sure that it's okay, we apply the peace-sign test and see that the middle finger points to the short rail well away from the nearest pocket. Further we see that a rolling cue ball, perhaps with a little right-hand english, moves easily and naturally into position for ball A and an easy run out. So, even though it's slightly

more difficult, we see that ball B is the better shot to play first.

Very often we find ourselves looking at a shot and asking, "Will I scratch?" And on too many of those occasions we shoot the shot only to catch ourselves grumbling soon afterwards, "Damn, I knew that was a scratch shot." It takes a lot of experience and many thousands of shots before we can paint

consistent mental pictures of the cue ball's path to predict position or scratches. With the peacesign method however, we have a simple yet reliable tool to make those predictions for a rolling cue ball across a broad range of cut angles.



Great Britain Wins World Team Championship

During the first week of February, 40 teams and 200 players from all over the world converged on Hannover, Germany to compete in the World Team Championships.

While great pool was played throughout the week, it was on day four that it began to get interesting. The US Boys and the outsiders from Greece played one of the most exciting matches of the tournament. Greece was ahead 3:1 as Johnny Archer and Shane Van Boening tied the score in two close matches. The Shoot-Out was the longest of the WTC yet. After overall around 50 tries and twenty strikes it was the Greece team that finally made two in a row while Oscar Dominguez failed. The final score was 12:10 and the Greece team showed the world that the USA can be beaten indeed.

The final day of the World Team Championship in Hannover Germany was all about Great Britain!

The final match of the event saw the squad with Darren Appleton, Daryl Peach, Mark Gray and Karl Boyes (Imran Majid did not play in this match) beat the Philippines with a clear and unexpected 4:1.

At the beginning in the 8-Ball doubles it looks like the Philippine team had everything under control. Dennis Orcullo and Warren Kiamco had no problems with the team of Karl Boyes and Daryl Peach. The Philippine duo scored an easy 6-1 win. Only a few moments later though, the British team came back with Darren Appleton and Mark Gray beating Ronnie Alcano and Marlon Manalo by the same 6-1 score.

The 9-Ball singles match of Boyes against Lee van Corteza was very close, but the other match between Mark Gray and Antonio Lining was over in just over 45 minutes. Gray made no mistakes and took all his chances for an 8-2 win

Compared to that match, the Boyes/Corteza match was a nailbiter. At the score of 7-6 Corteza, there was a one hour break for the final show of the fair that was taking place in the same hall the whole week. After the match was re-started, Boyes didn't miss a beat and took control for the 8-7 win and an overall 3-1 Great Britain lead.

That left Great Britain only needing one more point to win to hoist the trophy.

Darren Appleton had to play the unbeaten Dennis Orcollo and Daryl Peach met Ronnie Alcano at the second table. Former world champ Apple-



ton, was unbelievable in that match. He made absolutely no mistakes. Every position was perfect so in the end every shot was easy. Orcollo never really had a chance and at the same time he was struggling with his break. In the end, Darren was in dead stroke and scored a lopsided 7-1 win for his team.

WPA President Ian Anderson was on hand and presented the team from Great Britain with the big trophy.

The 600 spectators gave standing ovations to all the players who really deserved it.

Fans saw nine days of great pool and lots of action. The Shoot-Out was something really new and thrilling. All the teams, win or lose, liked the format; and so did the fans.

Texas Tornado Takes One Away from the Boys on Fast Eddie's Tour

Vivian Villareal, ranked # 7 on the WPBA list of players for 2009, joined 61 entrants on hand for the Fast Eddie's 9-Ball Tour stop in San Antonio, TX on the weekend of February 6-7 and got by them all. She and Jennifer Kraber were the only women entered in the \$1,500-added Open event, and Villareal became the first woman in nine years to win a stop on the Fast Eddie's tour.


The weekend tournament also featured a 10-entrant ladies event, held on Sunday and won by Kim Margeneau, who defeated Barbara Wisdom 7-5 in the finals. Wisdom had defeated Kyu Yi by the same score in the semifinals to face Margeneau.

From among the winner's side final four in the Open event, Villareal, known as the Texas Tornado, faced Sean Black and sent him west 9-6 for a meet-up with Charlie "Hillbilly" Bryant. Bryant had just finished sending Villareal's eventual finals opponent, Eduardo Ramirez over 9-7. Hillbillies being no strangers to tornados, Bryant dug in and battled Villareal to double hill be-

fore relinquishing the hot seat to the lady tornado.

Over on the one-loss side and already in the money, Rick Stanley lay in wait for Ramirez. Stanley had gotten by Brian Sanders 7-3 (Sanders having been sent west by Villareal) and then dropped Fast Eddie's veteran David Gutierrez into the tie for seventh place 7-4. Black picked up Zaid Thwieb, who'd defeated Andy Jethwa 7-5 and Ismael Ramirez 7-4 to reach him. Eduardo Ramirez began his three-match trip back to the finals with a 7-2 win over Stanley, as Black went hill-hill to defeat Thwieb. Ramirez advanced to the semifinals against Hillbilly with a hill-hill win over Black and followed that up with a hill-hill win over Hillbilly to set him up against the Texas Tornado.

In the modified double elimination final that followed, Villareal made a second race-to-seven set unnecessary. Ramirez stayed close, but in the end, Villareal pulled out in front to take it by two at 9-7 and bring home the \$1,180 first place prize.



Question:

"This is regarding stance: I've seen professional pool players on television bending over so low while taking a shot, that their chin touches the cue. Is this a way of aiming? What do you recommend?"

Answer:

In all other sports coaches from around the world remind their students to be "square to the shot". In pool that means having your belly-button towards the cue ball. If your stomach is facing forward then you automatically become square and your back becomes flat. Having a flat back means in the long run you will not hurt yourself from excessive play. Believe me when I say it is essential for your stance to be square and flat-top pros try and save their backs from long hours of play.

Also, if you are square to the shot then when you get down on the ball you will be flat on your cue. If you stand upright, you will never notice that your chin is resting/not resting on your cue. So, be square, flat backed, and chin resting on top of your cue. It's good for the game and good for your back. ©

Shu-Han Chang wins Regional Tour Championship

Taiwan's Shu-Han Chang is the new WPBA Regional Tour Champion.

With the new configuration of the WPBA Regional Tour system where non-exempt (players outside of the top 48 on the WPBA points list) can

only qualify for the WPBA Classic Tour via the Regional Tour Championship, the sixty three player field at this event was full of top talent. The first stage of the event saw the players separated into eight round robin groups with each player playing everyone else in their group a race to six. After a day and a half of those matches, the top thirty two players advanced and played another day of round robin action in eight groups of four players.

If the new round robin format was meant to create intrigue and drama for the players, it succeeded in a big way. Players not only found themselves with their backs to the wall on Sunday, but were also stuck sweating other matches and needing help from players that were opponents just one round ago. Two perfect examples were Heather Pulford who had to defeat Lisa Davids 6-0 in her last match in order to advance from her group (she failed to advance and Liz Lovely advanced instead) and Kim Pierce who found herself as the deciding factor between three players. If Pierce defeated Emily Duddy 6-4 in their final round match, then Pierce would advance. A loss to Duddy would mean Duddy advanced and a 6-5 Pierce win would mean that a third player, 14 year old Brianna Miller, would advance. Duddy pulled the match out hill-hill and proudly earned her tour card.

The eight players who advanced out of phase two were all awarded WPBA Tour cards, with a ninth card going to the top player (based on Game Win/Loss Percentage) who did not advance from phase two. That award would go to Arizona's Susan Williams. The final eight players were them seeded into a single elimination brackets based on their winning percentages in phase two. While Chang, who is currently ranked #1 in Asia and qualified via the new former Taipei Tour, was a big favorite in this event from the start; it was actually Amy Chen who came out of her group with the best percentage. Chen's award for that top seed was a match with Kim Benson from the Western Women's Regional Tour. Showing that she was

not impressed with Chen's previous performance, Benson scored the 9-7 upset win to advance into the final four. Joining Benson in the final four were Mary Rakin (9-7 win over Lisa Marr), Chang (9-5 win over Liz Lovely) and Naomi Williams (9-5 win over Emily Duddy). Up to this point in the event, Chang had remained undefeated but had failed to really "wow" the crowd as most fans had expected. That turned around in the next round of play as Chang upped her game a level and dominated Canadian Naomi Williams. At the same time, Kim Benson's event was brought to an end by California's Mary Rakin 9-5. This left Rakin and Chang to fight for the first prize of \$1400 in cash and paid entry into the 2010 WPBA Classic Tour Events.

As well as Rakin had played in this event, the finals were really about Chang who took advantage of almost every opportunity she was given and rolled to a 9-3 win over Rakin. Rakin was able to console herself with \$2000 in cash and the coveted WPBA Tour Card.

The event took place at Hard Times Billiards in Bellflower California and both room staff and tournament directors and volunteers put on an outstanding show all weekend long. The fans were entertained by the top regional players in the world and were wowed by a player who could very well be the next great Asian star on the WPBA Tour.


