

How to Master Balls Hanging in Pockets


Pool players striving to improve often overlook certain aspects of the game because they seem too simple to be a priority when there is so much to learn. Unfortunately some of the "simple" shots come back repeatedly to cause problems for the player who hasn't spent time learning them. A good example of this phenomenon is a ball hanging near the pocket, particularly a corner pocket.

Despite that a ball sitting in the jaws of a corner can consistently cause problems for many players very few will take time to practice and learn how best to play the shot. Maybe this occurs because a person doesn't want to look silly practicing something so easy. Problems with this shot originate early in a pool player's career when after suffering discouragement from missing other shots he views the ball hanging in the corner with great delight. In his eagerness to pocket the ball he does not consider

how to hit it. Problems continue with this shot because the object ball will be pocketed regardless of where it is hit unlike most shots where the object ball must be hit precisely to pocket it. This month we shall ex-


plore this common shot and begin work to master it.

Look at the diagram and set up the shot. The most common disaster with a ball hanging in the corner pocket occurs when the player needs to pocket the ball and get the cue ball back to the other end of the table for the next shot. Instead of rebounding off of the short rail and rolling down to the other end of the table the cue ball often remains up at the same end of the table even when struck very hard. This happens for two reasons: the cue ball has too much topspin and the object ball is struck too full. To practice the shot freeze the cue ball to the bottom rail at position 1 and set up an object ball to play for on the same rail. This setup calls for a thin hit on the object ball, its right edge for the shot in the diagram, and a cue ball that is rolling naturally without any topspin. A thin hit on the object ball here allows you to hit the shot softly and therefore with a cue ball that is rolling rather than spinning forward. To keep the cue ball on the same side of the table for a shot on a ball at position B hit the object ball very thin



maybe with a little inside (left) english. No english and a slightly fuller hit on the object ball will return the cue ball to the opposite side of the table for a ball at position A.

Jasmin Ouschan has accomplished what no other athlete has ever done at the European Championships and has won gold in all four disciplines. She won the 8-Ball, 9-Ball, 10-Ball and the 14.1 events and did so in grand style.

She went totally undefeated in the 14.1 and defeated Gerda Hofstatter 75-19 in the finals. She then went completely undefeated in the 10-Ball and defeated Ina Jentschura 6-3. She also went undefeated in the 8 Ball competition and defeated Line Kjorsvik 6-5 in the finals. Finally, she cruised through the 9 Ball field, suffering one loss there to Line Kjorsvik, and then came back and bested Gerda Hofstatter again in the finals, this time by the score of 7-0 to totally dominate and sweep the entire event! Are there any questions? Not here. With this performance Ouschan has proven to have fulfilled her promise and her potential and she now stands well atop the European pool scene. Look no further when in search of the Queen of the Game.

There was a bit more variety on the men's side of the arena. Konstantin Stepanov came out ahead of Marcus Chamat 8-6 to take the 8-Ball title while Ralf Souquet slipped by Mateusz Sniegocki 9-8 to grab the 9-Ball gold. Souquet also won gold in the 10-Ball division,


beating Niels Feijen 7-4 in the final match. David Alcaide took the 14.1 honors by destroying Artem Koshovyi 125 – 3 in the final match.

In the wheelchair division Kurt Deklerck narrowly got past Henrik Larson to earn the top tier in the 8-Ball division while Jouni Tahti got past the same man, Larson, to win the gold in the 9-Ball section. Tahti also grabbed his second gold in the 10-Ball division by handing a 5-0 doughnut to Roy Kimberly.

Congratulations go out to all of the new champions. The European Championships sport large and powerful fields and to win there is an honor indeed.

The Fox has Many Tricks and the Hedgehog Only One ...

In recent weeks, I have decided to re-enter the world of pool gambling.

For the past two or three years, I've mainly stuck to tournaments. It is my opinion (some would disagree) that tournament play and gambling are two very different fields, although excellence in one can definitely help in the other. Tournament pool reminds me of good old-fashioned English vs. Norman medieval warfare: you meet at an appointed time at an appointed place, fight, break for lunch, and maybe a game of chess, fight again, conclude when it gets dark, and everyone goes home until the bell rings tomorrow morning and you start all over. Honor is held in high esteem and fairness is practiced all around. Last man standing out of several thousand wins.

Gambling, on the other hand, is definitely guerilla warfare.

You may agree on a venue, a time, and maybe even settle a fair game, but after all that, it's a free-for-all. You can play for an hour or several days or months, and even years. Sharking can be included, as well as incessant complaints and threats. These features may not be pleasant, but it is definitely

part of the package. You play one entity for an extended length of time as opposed to several different entities for a short time each (although you must still be pretty damn strong to last an entire tournament). The man with all the money wins. And the house. The house always wins.

I am a fairly decent tournament player, but I want to build up my arsenal of skills, so I'm taking up gambling. As many of you know, a single race in your average tournament (rarely going longer than 11, most women's are to seven or even five) does not necessarily determine the better player. Now, a session of several sets, or a long "ahead" set, most likely will determine the better player (at the game being played, with the handicap provided, if provided). It is a test of endurance, heart, and acumen, as you have an opportunity to observe your opponent's game with its strengths and weaknesses and adjust your own game accordingly.

So, in my endless and misguided quest to become the best pool player who ever lived, I decided, yep, it's time to grow up and get in some action.

Last week, I dropped in on a local handicapped nine-ball tournament. I hadn't played big tables in a while (short people prefer short tables, we can reach everything), and I needed to get back in the swing of things since my bar leagues were ending. My handicap was a good, solid C+. Go ahead and talk your smack, but a C+ still gets you the diploma in any school, last time I checked. In the second round, I drew a player I shall refer from now on as **HEDGEHOG**.

Last I remembered, which was, granted a couple of years ago, Hedgehog was a D player. According to his current ranking he had risen through the rankings to a B. Impressive. As a result, I was to get the last two from him. I must say, I liked the game, and I was arrogant entering into the match. It was a race to three, loser breaks.

The first game featured a spectacular safety and kick battle on the one-ball that lasted a good nine or ten innings. In the middle of the game, I played a nice safe that got me ball-in-hand on the six-ball, and, I ran out. Yay. I can run four balls! Improvement in my game is evident already.

The second game featured me missing a makeable eight ball.

Ditto for the third.

The APA Jack & Jill Championship is held in conjunction with the APA National Singles Championships, which will also include the 9-Ball Classic and 9-Ball Shootout national championship tournaments.

Last year, the APA National Singles Championships, along with the MiniMania events, paid out more than \$300,000 in prize money with \$5,000 going to the 1st Place winner of the Jack &Jill 8-Ball Championship.

ANY WHERE BUT HERE AND EASY MATCH are members of the Metro Denver APA Pool League and participate in weekly league play at RACK'EM CUE CLUB AND FAMOUS DOOR both locations in AURORA COLORADO. Team Members include: JEFF HARRINGTON, LAURIE STAPLETON, AMY GLADU AND ROBERT WILIAMS.

The APA, based in Lake Saint Louis, MO., sanctions the world's largest amateur pool league, known as the APA Pool League throughout the United States and as the Canadian Pool League in Canada. More than 250,00 members compete in weekly 8-Ball and 9-Ball league play. The APA is generally recognized as the Governing Body of Amateur Pool, having established the official rules, championships, formats and handicap systems for the sport of amateur billiards.

The APA produces three major tournaments each year--the APA National Team Championships, the APA National Singles Championships and the U.S. Amateur Championship--that, together, pay out nearly \$1.5 Million in cash and prizes annually.



Q & A with WPBA Pro Melissa Little

Question:

"I read in the Cue Times that you recently won the 8-ball event at the US Bar Table Championships, so I've got an 8-Ball strategy question for you. I've always heard the phrase: "Don't run 7 if you can't run 8". My question is, if I analyze the balls and I know I can't run the rack because of one or two problems, how many balls should I pocket or should I not pocket any at all to leave more obstructions for my opponent?"

Answer:

You're asking a 9-ball player an 8-ball question - but considering that I did finish 3rd in the 2009 BCAPL 8-Ball Grand Masters and won the US 8-Ball Bar Table Championships in Reno, I guess I can share some tips with you how I finished so well. Honestly, I was learning to play 8-ball as the tournament went on- with the help of some of the Worlds Best (Shane, Oscar and Mark) who gave me a few tricks up my sleeve to help me along the way. So, I accepted the challenge and tried my best.

8-ball is a very difficult game.... there is a lot more to the game than people think. I noticed that when I approached the pool table with a run out mentality and visualized my pattern, by looking first at the 8-ball and working backwards to create my pattern, I sometimes ran out. When it works, it looks great and you look like you know what you're doing. But when I got into trouble, I had to have a new plan and come up with a smart safety.

Now, when I didn't have a clear pattern or when I got out of line, I strategized by plugging the holes with my balls and handed my opponent an opportunity to try and run out. When they got stuck and started scratching there heads won-

dering why they did not get out, I thought to my self "this is working" Later, it seemed like someone tapped me on the shoulder and said "you won the tournament and you can now put your cue away" I surprised myself by winning the 8-ball championships!

So, back to the question - you have to have a plan and stick with it and if you get into trouble play safe and if you know you can't get out then plug the holes with your balls and watch your opponent try and when they make a mistake then you must capitalize on your opportunity.





Get it Straight with Straight Pool





I have recently become completely obsessed with straight pool, aka 14.1 continuous or simply 14.1. This classic discipline was the game of choice for many of the old school

legendary players. It was the game played in the 1961 movie, The Hustler, starring Jackie Gleason and Paul Newman. A player's worth was measured by their high run and even then, the better player could still get shut out by steady ball-pocketing and patient safety play.

These days, straight pool players seem to be a dying breed. Most recently, "Mr. 400" John Schmidt has made the game popular again. I've had the honor of watching him run 100+ balls in person on more than one occasion and it inspires me be a better player.

Most recently, I watched John run 204 balls at the 2010 Super Billiards Expo 14.1 Challenge organized by Steve & Heather Kurtz and Charlie Eames. The run was made on a 9' Diamond proam with fresh cloth, fairly clean balls, in 80 degree greasy, humid heat. Spectators were gathered on both sides to watch. His run was not perfect. Several times he got out of line and was forced to shoot recovery shots to get back in the game. According to him, his run was not textbook but with strong



shot-making and savvy position play at the end of each rack, he strung together 14 and a half racks. That's true a testament to his tenacity.

Objective

Straight pool is a call-pocket game. Balls may be pocketed in any pocket, in any order. One point is received for each ball pocketed. Players shoot until they miss, play a safety, or they reach their target match points. The 15th ball from each rack is left untouched on the table along with the cue ball. The remaining 14 balls are racked, leaving the head ball empty. The player continues to shoot attempting to pocket the 15th ball while breaking open the newly racked balls to continue their run.

Benefits

Since I began playing more straight pool, I have seen noticeable improvements in the following areas:

- I pocket balls with better speed. There is an 'ideal' speed that comes along with the game. I learned very quickly that you don't need to slam the balls. In fact, it's better if you don't.
- My breakouts in 8-ball have been much more precise. Instead of just busting into a cluster, I'm much more confident in knowing which balls will go where.
- I feel good about my combination shots.
 They come up fairly often in straight pool runs.
- I'm reminded of the 'every single shot matters' mentality. In this day of alternate-breaks, we're guaranteed to have another chance at the table. It can be easy to take a shot for granted here and there. In straight pool, one missed shot could cost you 25 or 50 balls, or even the match. If you do get another chance at the table, you need to warm up again from sitting so long.



Mastering the first shot puts you well on your way to total mastery of balls hanging in the pocket. For the rest of the exercise you can move the cue ball out to the second diamond to work more with controlling its path off of the object ball. With the cue ball at position 2 let's examine a principle of this shot. Try first to return the cue ball to the opposite side of the table for a ball on the bottom rail at position A. Hit the cue ball one-half tip above center with no english and take a thin hit on the right edge of the object ball. Practice the shot until you are returning the cue ball to hit at position 3 on the opposite long rail with proper speed for a good shot on your next ball.

When the next ball sits on the bottom rail at position B you need to play three-rail position. Hit the cue ball one half-tip above center with some right-hand english and the object ball thin on its right side but not at the edge. Practice the shot until you are rolling the cue ball two rails through the center of the table to the first or second diamond on the bottom of the left long rail and landing with proper speed for a shot on the ball at position B. These two shots illustrate the principle of playing a ball in the pocket when you are required to move the cue ball. For both shots you must take a thin hit on the object ball and roll the cue ball naturally with no forward spin.

From the other side of the table at position 3 things change a little but the principles remain

the same. To get to the ball at position A you will hit the object ball on its right side but not the edge and perhaps with a little outside english. Practice returning the cue ball to the long rail at the spot from which you just shot, position 3. When you are playing for a ball at position B you will hit the right edge of the object ball maybe using some inside english to roll the cue ball down the same



long rail for your next shot. On this shot you risk a scratch in the bottom corner or hitting the point of the side pocket and rolling out of position. To avoid both errors practice the shot until you can hit the left long rail one diamond before the side pocket consistently.

There are many variations of shots with balls hanging in the pocket that can present problems for the shooter; we have merely touched the surface in this discussion. Problems arise when the player looks ahead to the shot and dismisses it as easy rather than giving it proper consideration for its place in the run. As with any shot it is not ease or difficulty that deserves attention but rather the shot's place in the run and how best to play it to continue that run. Balls hanging in the pocket often merit longer consideration because of the numerous options they present. When you treat every shot, regardless of its perceived difficulty, with proper consideration you are playing closer to greatness.





Bill Skinner Wins 16th Annual Dr. Cue 8-Ball Tournament

Player from the Denver Area Wins for the Third Consecutive Year

Pueblo, Colorado. The first thing he said after he dropped the last 8-Ball is "My name goes on the plaque!" During the two day tournament Bill would come over to the Tournament Board and ask, "How come everybody else has their first names with their last initial and I'm listed as just "SKINNER"? I thought about it and told him maybe because whenever I would see you in Vegas or Denver and would say Hello, most of the time you wouldn't answer me. I figured I didn't know you well enough to call you Bill. I told him that I could change it to Bill S. but

No luck was needed though, Bill played as well as I have ever seen him play and really made winning look easy. Coming out of a field of a full bracket of 128 players, Bill came through the Loser's Side to beat Fred Maestas of Albuquerque, NM, twice to win the event. The tournament began Saturday around 12:30 p.m. and 96 players would be eliminated that day. Because of some slow and cautious play, getting to the final 32 money matches would take until 2:30a.m. Sunday morning.

The field of players was well represented by players from Denver, Colorado Springs, Pueblo, and for the first time, Albuquerque. Of course, our regulars from Canon City, Alamosa, Montrose, La Junta, and one player from Oklahoma were in attendance. Because of the full field of 128 players and only 13 tables to play on, the race was to 4 on both sides of the bracket. The first games went fast and the tournament moved along great. As we got more involved, the matches slowed down, players who waited quite a while to play began grumbling as they usually do, but eventually everybody had finished their first few matches.

This year we had the most women participants ever, 11. Terry Duncan and Jackie Karol tied for Top Woman Player and split the \$400 dollar prize. One woman pro player managed to get into the tournament unknown, but was discovered after making the top 32 money matches. We did print on the flyer that "No Pros" were allowed, so she was disqualified and forfeited all money. To say the least, it was disappointing that this happened and we will make every effort to make sure this does not happen again.

128 Players and a total purse of \$9820.00 is a Tournament best. We hope to do this again next year but as always with improvements. A few things come to mind. At least 2 more tables, signups and auction possibly on Friday night. With more tables, a longer race. One other thing we are trying to make happen is a Fall 9-Ball tournament. We are trying to work out a 1st Annual Dr. Cue 9-Ball for September.

To try and describe the various matches and play of a two day, 128 bracket tournament is impossible. To see the caliber of player present and the caroms, kicks, banks and just all around good play will be remembered for quite a while. We would like to thank all the participants, the regulars who come every year, and also the first timers that couldn't believe this was the 16th year and they had never heard about it before. All are welcome and appreciated, and again, thank you. A very special Thank You to Ben, Tiff and Gino for helping make this year's Dr. Cue so successful along with all the help received from so many true friends in the preparation for the tournament.

The biggest thank you should go to Dr. Cue and Marty for making the trip every year and making the tournament such a big success. Without him the tournament just wouldn't be the same. The joy of watching first timers at the exhibition "oooooo" and "aaaawwww" as he demonstrates some of the most remarkable trick shots and to watch participants get so excited to be able to make a shot he set up for them. Thank you so very much...

From your nightly dues, \$1.00 goes into the "League End" Tournament Fund and \$1.00 goes into the "Multi League" Tournament Fund.

League End Tourney Fund:

If there are 8 teams in the league and you play only 14 weeks you will have: 8 teams times 5 players times \$1 times 14 weeks = **\$560.00** in the league end tourney fund. There will be no entry fee into the league end tourney for all players that have played at least 1/2 of the scheduled league nights (21 weeks needs 11 weeks to meet the 1/2 of the league weeks) . If a players has played 3 or more weeks but less than 1/2 of the weeks, they will have an entry fee pro-rated by \$1 per week (\$8 if only 3 weeks of a 21 week league). All league end tourneys will be handicapped where possible and more players will receive a chunk of the purse.

Multi League Tournaments will have an entry fee:

and are for all players that are playing under the \$-\$ Format only. players will have to meet the weekly requirements for each event and be up to date with current sanctioning. Events such as: Singles, Teams and Scotch Doubles will be used for both 8-ball and 9-ball. Divisions of A's and up and B's and down will be available as well. Most events will have an entry fee and will be handicapped and the cash will be paid further down the chart. These tournaments will happen 2, 3 or more times during the year. Example: if there are only 250 players playing each week and there are 42 weeks played each year, there would be over \$10,000 available for these tournaments.
