

Note from Editor: Due to an ongoing health issue, Tom will not be contributing new articles for awhile. For now, we will dip into his vast archives while he's on the mend. Please keep Tom in your thoughts and prayers.

Nine ball's new prominence as the standard game has influenced several changes in the way we now play pool. Because the game forces the player to hit one ball and rewards a good safety with cue ball in hand the player must be able to answer a safety effectively. When one-foul nine ball first emerged on the pool scene any kind of snooker could effectively disable a good player. That is no more. Whatever one thinks about the talent of current stars compared to heroes from the past, the best players nowadays perform two shots, the kick and jump, with more deadly precision than was even imagined only twenty years ago.

In a situation with no clear shot at the object ball you have two basic options, a kick shot or a jump shot. If you want to play competitive nine ball and you do not feel comfortable with these

shots decide now that you will learn and practice them. Every player possesses some rudimen-


tary skill for sending the cue ball one or more rails first to hit an object ball and

has room for improvement or refinement with kick shots. If you cannot execute a jump shot you know someone who can and should ask that person to show you how it is done. Instead of trying to impart the basics of executing kicks and jumps here I want to explore the simple question of when to choose which shot.

Before we begin let me make a recommendation. If you play competitively and do not own a jump cue, consider buying one. If you are resistant for the reason that they are not allowed on the men's pro tour, leave your jump cue in its case during your professional matches. Major league baseball does not allow aluminum bats but that does not prevent their use in any baseball league where they are allowed. Recently in a small tournament match with Danny Medina, a perennial star of the pro tour, I was feeling pretty good about the fact that I hooked him on a two ball. I then watched as he took out his jump cue, fired the ball in

and ran out the rack. The jump cue makes jump shots easy and is a tool available to everyone to help win games.

Unfortunately for James, it was a rules technicality that allowed Fugal close the gap, making it hill-hill. With momentum on his side, he took the next game and would face Kato in the finals. Kato failed to capitalize on Fugal's early mistakes leading to a two-set finals. Fugal missed a 10 ball in the final set but left it tricky enough for a returned miss by Kato.

Though Fugal's opponents had mutual opportunities for the win, due to his overall strong performance, he's graciously agreed to sit out the next A's and Down. Maybe we'll see him playing in the main event next time?



Imagine, if you will, that due to various factors including the Pursuit of a Better Future, you have not been able to play any quality pool lately. This is all right as pool is not life, contrary to what you preach to the public. There has to be balance and during the times you are not a pool player, your schizophrenic billiard personality goes into hibernation. When it wakes up, it is hungry.

You look at the clock. It is late — but not too late. If you hurry, you can still squeeze in an hour of practice at day rate. You have spent much time in the past month cramming for tests for a Better Future and now, you are feeling slightly anxious because you have pool tests tournaments coming up and you need to cram practice for those. You get up from being warm and idle, go out into the cold, and wait for a bus running on holiday schedule.

You make it to the pool room with 56 minutes left on day rate. Cool. You can handle that. It is league night and every table is taken by league players or casual bangers. There is one table open and that is good enough.

You start by trying to run a rack of nine-ball.

Your mechanics feel awkward but that is to be expected after a layoff. You forge bravely ahead and continue to hit balls into the rail with authority, but that is all right because you are here and playing pool and playing pool is nice. Even with all the noise and hordes of people causing your claustrophobic twitches to surface — it is still nice.

As you continue to shoot you are disrupted by a constant stream of league players and beer-carrying recreationals. It is hard to get into a rhythm, but you tell yourself to just plow through it. You plow through the shot into the table every time someone shoves you unaware. Finally, you think, okay, maybe I'll stop trying to run balls and just stay in one spot to do drills. I'll run into less people this way. The people are actually the ones running into you, but you want to be fair about sharing space.

You do drills from the foot of the table but quickly realize people like to squeeze by between you and the wall while carrying overfilled pitchers and bottles of brew. You wonder what makes people a yard wide think they can fit in the foot-wide gap between the end of your cue and the wall. You wonder why these clowntards do not think to use the walkway behind the wall which is there for that very purpose. You are

pushed, prodded, and spilled upon. And these simpletons look at you as if you are the discourteous one. You take a deep breath and tell yourself you will not let anything stop you from enjoying your time at the table. You crack your neck and knuckles and say again that you will not let anything stop you from enjoying your time at the table.

The day rate ends. You have not been able to get any decent practice in so you continue and go on night rate. You did not budget for the night rate but you will only play until you feel like the old you — the one that could sometimes run two balls — again. It should not take long. The clock starts now. Every five heartbeats costs a penny. It will be easy to run up a tab you could spend a lifetime paying.

The banger crowd thins out. You do passably well at drills so you think to reward yourself with trying to run balls again. Your effort this time around is light-years better but you are still Hedgehog short of where you should be. How about we just run one rack, you say to yourself. Just one rack and then we get the hell out of here.

8-Ball: You don't have to get out now, just get out

As our pool game improves, so does our game plan. We discover how much more enjoyable it is when we win. We learn to shoot defensive shots. We realize that sometimes the

first one to attempt the run out may not always be the one who wins the game.

Eventually, we appreciate that in order to win more games, patience trumps pride. Sure, it feels great to break and run, but oftentimes tables are just not very run-friendly. We just have to accept that we don't need to get out in this inning. It's now that we ask ourselves, "Is it more important to win this game or to be the hero?"

You may have three shots in front of you that you can make, but if none of them help you break out that trouble ball, then QUIT RUN-NING! Basic 8-ball strategy tells us when we have one or more balls tied up, it is to our advantage to keep more traffic on the table. If you don't have a plan to get your guys out of jail, keep as many soldiers around as possible.

League or team play environments do not neces-

sarily encourage to the smartest, game-winning decisions. Far too often, during a team scenario, I've witnessed players go for the run out when it's nearly impossible. It's stuck in their mind that they must be the "hero." They don't want to let their teammates down. They must get the "points" and they must try to run out whenever they get to the table.

In many leagues, the more balls your opponent has left on the table, the higher you can score for that win. This scoring system only promotes super aggressive play. Instead of thinking, "How can I win this game?" their objective shifts to "How can I win this game *now*?" Many times, this mentality can backfire on them. When they force a run out that isn't there, true, sometimes they can get lucky, but very often they just clear all their balls out of the way and leave their opponents a back door run out. That's the worst thing they can do.

It's critical to analyze the table. Take a good look at where the balls are lying. Do you have more than one cluster to deal with? Do you have a way to address each of them? Are you confident you will make the shot that you're facing? Are you certain you'll have something to shoot at after your break out(s)? If you answered "no" or you're unsure of any of these questions, then you may want to consider ducking for now and running out later.

Think about lagging a ball in front of a pocket and blocking it from your opponent. If you can't get out, make your opponent have to work for it. Play a safety where you can also bank one of your balls down by the trouble. Position your balls on the table so they are in your favor. Get them ready for you to take advantage later. Lock up safeties that can get you ball in hand are much easier to play when you have more balls on the table to hide behind.

Remember, if you can't get out now, don't. If you can't run out now, position your balls and run out later. A win is a win whether it happens now or later.

The league players are still here. Since it is close quarters, you find yourself having to wait for them to shoot. You give them first right of way because since they are competing, you think they are somehow more important than you. You are only practicing to achieve an impossible dream. You also give them first right of way because you believe they will allow you to shoot afterwards in turn. It would be the courteous thing to do.

It does not happen.

They are oblivious that you, too, would like to shoot a ball sometime.

You are irritated at waiting and the discourtesy. Your heart pounds faster and now you count heartbeats by the dime. You stand there and try very hard to affect an air of patient indifference as the league player takes FOREVER to survey the table. My God, shoot the damn four-ball! If you make it you're out - if you miss, you have an automatic safety. FOR THE LOVE OF HUMANITY JUST SHOOT THE DAMN FOUR!! One of the most painful things in life has got to be watching someone struggle with a question you know the answer to and not be able to tell them. This is why so many people offer unsolicited advice. It is admirable when one can control that impulse.

Deep breaths, dude. Deep. Breaths.

Watching the league player consider several obvious not-so-good options is like watching a horror movie and wondering why the chick always hears a scary sound upstairs — and then has to go investigate. Is that a chainsaw revving? I think that's a chainsaw revving! There's also a serial killer out on the loose but I should make sure that chainsaw upstairs isn't being wielded by a serial killer! It will turn out bad but you go ahead anyways.

Hey, you tell yourself as you reel your sanity back in, don't be a pool snob. No one is born knowing how to play pool. You were a crappy player once — and you're a crappy player still.

The league player finally lines up the four-ball. YES! You Tebow. Every muscle and nerve of your being is a guitar string wound taut. The league player takes seventeen torturous warm-up strokes. She pauses at the end of the backstroke. Mid-stroke, she changes her mind and stands up. Somewhere in the universe, a guitar string snaps with a dying twang. Your tooth cracks from the pressure of your clenched jaw.

You give up and pick up your cue ball and move it to the other side of the table just so you can shoot something.

You are hemorrhaging by the dollar.

All you want to do is run ONE rack of nine-ball, but you are perpetually thwarted by endless Seriously Serious League Players. You must choose between waiting an eternity or breaking the rules of your runout by moving the cue ball somewhere else just so you can remember what it is like to hit a ball. You vacillate between hating all league players and remembering that you were a league player once and everyone has the right to take their time to shoot a shot. You try very hard not to break another tooth.

Salvation comes when the league player needs to take a bathroom break and the match is paused. You calculate the player has had an entire pitcher and you might have two minutes to achieve your shortterm dream. You run nine balls and the way you run them makes you envision Paul Newman's last lines in The Color of Money, "I'm BACK!" You would look good with a moustache and gradienttinted aviator sunglasses.



Shane Van Boening has won the Players Championship at the Super Billiards Expo and has sent yet another strong message that he is the cream of the American crop of pro pool players. When Shane gets close to the finals there is just no stopping him. Even a long trip throughout the one-loss side (Shane lost early to Brian Brekke) cannot cause his game to weaken or his heart to lose spirit.

On Sunday Van Boening swept aside the rest of the best as if they were mere mortals trying to exist in the realm of the gods. Raj Hundal got the message first when he just sat and watched as Van Boening picked the meat off of his bones and tossed him to the scrap heap 10-1. Hundal was no more a participant in that match than was the kid in the third row of the stands. Darren Appleton would fare little better. The two-time US Open champion was dismantled and destroyed by the rack-running ability of the

South Dakota Kid. Obviously dismayed by Van Boening's ability to control the table and deny an opponent any opportunity to rally, Appleton found himself a 10-2 loser against Van Boening who only appeared to get stronger with each stroke.

Van Boening had one more hill to climb. An undefeated and confident Stevie Moore was waiting for him. That confidence would take an early beat-down as Van Boeing wasted no time in establishing a 7-0 lead in the final race to 13 games. All of this comes on the heels of a final quarter of 2011 that presented Van Boening with victories at the Steve Mizerak Championship, Turning Stone XVIII and at the Ocho Open.


The diagram illustrates two situations with no clear shot at the shaded object ball. In shot A I prefer the jump shot for the following reasons. First, the object ball is out toward the middle of the table where it is more difficult to hit rail first. Second, with the obstruction removed, the shot is straight in. A great feature of the jump shot is that the cue ball's movement is up and down instead of side to side and the cue ball goes where you aim it. Another feature of a straight-in jump shot is that the full hit on the object ball will absorb most of the cue ball's energy to stop it from bouncing off of the table. Making a jump shot here and pocketing that ball is not easy but easier than pocketing the ball with a kick shot. That brings us to the most important factor to consider in the choice between a jump and kick shot. Where do the balls end up if I do not pocket the object ball? In shot A any possible kick at the object is more likely than not to leave both balls at the same end of the table and a shot for your opponent.

Shot B is an entirely different situation. Even the most dedicated and talented jumper should elect to kick here. Two factors to rule out the jump shot are that the obstruction is closer to the

object ball than it is to the cue ball and that the shot is a cut shot near a rail making it nearly impossible to pocket the ball and keep a bouncing cue ball on the table. Here the correct choice is the kick shot for several reasons. First, the object ball is close to a rail making it very easy to hit. And this shot offers two effective options. If you hit this ball one rail first, the solid-line path, and catch it right you can bank it off the side rail toward point X on the bottom rail while leaving the cue ball behind the obstructing ball. The same thing can be accomplished kicking the object ball two rails first, the dashed-line path. This choice sends the object ball directly toward point X and can leave the cue ball behind the obstructing ball. I would choose the second option and play for the two-rail kick with some right-hand english. If I miss hit the shot and catch the object ball too thin I still send it to the other end of the table while the cue ball goes straight across the table and rebounds off the opposite side rail with right-hand english toward point Y.

There's no question that nine ball has changed pool and, over the past few years, has changed dramatically itself. When you watch professionals, who rarely fail to run out from an open shot, you will see that the game now usually turns on playing safety and responding to safety. As you become more comfortable with your ability to hit a jump shot and execute a kick shot with a plan for its outcome your progress toward greatness will make a leap as you

approach a hook situation with confidence that you have choices.
