Note from Editor: Due to an ongoing health issue, Tom will not be contributing new articles for awhile. For now, we will dip into his vast archives while he's on the mend. Please keep Tom in your thoughts and prayers.

December 2001

On most pool shots, especially anything but the most routine ones under a little pressure, we tend to apply all of our focus simply to shooting the object ball into the pocket. Sometimes the shot's importance and the amount of pressure can combine to make that pocket look pretty small. So it may come as a surprise to some that the best players often, perhaps always, choose exactly which part of the pocket they want the object ball to hit. The concept of using the whole pocket is well known to most players but I wonder how many have spent dedicated practice time working with it.

Before we begin with an exercise I want to discuss the relationship between the sizes of the pocket openings and the balls. On a nine-foot table the standard pocket opening for a corner is $4\frac{7}{8}$ inches, for a side, $5\frac{3}{8}$ inches. A pool ball is $2\frac{1}{4}$ inches in diameter meaning that a standard table has space at the opening of a corner for two full balls with $\frac{3}{8}$ of an inch to spare while a side allows for two full balls with $\frac{7}{8}$ of



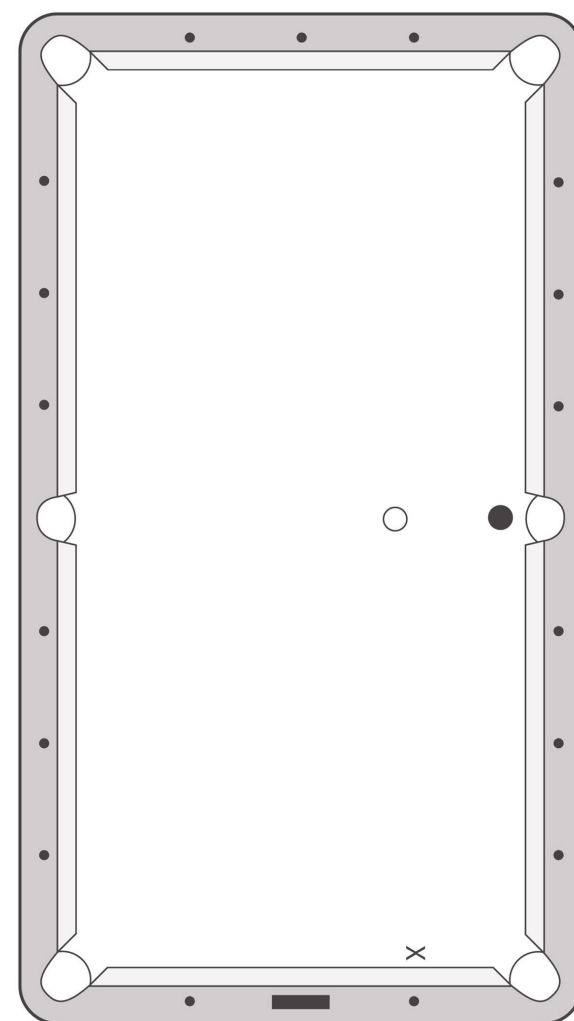
an inch leftover. An extremely tight table can have four-inch openings at the corner pockets, which still allow for a full ball and 77 percent of a second one; the side pockets on a tight table usually conform to the standard difference at a half-inch wider than the corners and therefore allow two full balls. So, even the tightest tables give us some room to work with on many shots.

Because most of us begin playing pool with making the shot as our only objective and counting a ball that falls into any part of the pocket as a success, using the entire pocket is something that must be learned. The ability to match a shot angle in a situation where the player has options with it to the same angle from a shot where the player is forced to shoot the object ball one way requires a small leap in conceptual thinking. In other words, players who know how the cue ball will move on a shot that offers one certain angle do not always know how to identify and choose that same angle from a straight-in shot with a big pocket.

Set up the shot in the diagram with the object ball about four inches from the lip of the side pocket and centered with the opening. Place the cue ball about one foot back making sure that the shot is aligned dead straight to the center of the pocket then mark the balls' positions. From this setup you will be able to hit every diamond on the table, as well as the other five pockets, with the cue ball.

Begin by shooting a few shots with no regard for the cue ball. Shoot a few exactly straight in and shoot some cutting the object a little to the left and then the right. Cut some very slightly and play some to rub the pocket facings as they fall in. When you think that you have hit just about every part of the side pocket you can begin working the cue ball.

Start with a straight draw shot that scratches in the opposite side pocket. Now play another draw shot where you cut the object ball just enough to the left to draw the cue ball to the first diamond right of the opposite side pocket. DO NOT USE RIGHT OR LEFT-HAND ENGLISH ANYWHERE IN THIS EXERCISE. Play one



now adding enough cut to draw the cue ball two diamonds to the right of the opposite side pocket. Keep moving the cue ball, a diamond at a time, counter clockwise around the table by adjusting the angle at which you cut the object ball. Play for the scratches as you encounter pockets along the way. When you arrive at diamond X you will begin using stun draw by moving your tip up toward center ball and hitting the shot with a firm punch stroke. That technique will apply as you move around the corner and along the side rail, moving your tip up on the cue ball as the target diamonds approach the pocket you are using. Of course you will want to continue around the table until you arrive back at the draw shot into the opposite side pocket. From there spend some time experimenting with follow to hit five different spots on the rail, a ball width apart from one another, between the side pocket and the first diamonds to the left and right of it.

This is a great exercise to develop awareness of the what's possible with a big pocket in addition to honing accuracy and stroke. After completing it you will no doubt be an expert with the shot that you were practicing but there's a hidden benefit. You now know how to look at and hit an object ball with more precision. From now on you can play every shot choosing an exact spot in the pocket instead of merely choosing the pocket. For corner-pocket shots where the object ball does not have a direct line to the center of the pocket, the best description I've heard of the spot to hit is the point where black meets green, that is where the pocket facing meets the pocket liner. What you will find is that choosing a pinpoint target will improve your shot making. As you learn to sharpen your focus on smaller targets the space around them may begin to appear increasingly larger.

4th Annual Chet Itow Memorial

Chew Itow was the founder of my favorite pool room of all time, the California Billiard Club. He died of cancer back in 2009 and a memorial tournament in held in his honor each year. The game is nine-ball and the races are to eight on both sides.

Unspoken, but generally acknowledged rule of road trips: Those most likely to cash get to sleep on the way to the tournament.

Also: Those who cannot drive get to sleep on the way to the tournament. Because we all want to live.

We went to visit my mother and brother (that's right, even bitches like me got family 'n' sh#t). After a yummy home-cooked dinner, we headed back to the pool room to see what was up.

I ran into a good number of people who had been recently entertained by my writings about - - HOVERCAT. Then I ran into a number of people who liked to drink. Some of these drinkers had also been entertained by Hovercat. Beers were bought for me. I'm usually very good about NOT drinking before a tournament, but this was a once-in-a-Blue-Moon moment where I was not very good.

Day 1

Uh. I don't remember much about this day because I had the remnants of a sPEctAcULaR hangover for most of the first half. I somehow blundered through the brackets and when I wasn't sh#tting out, I was trying to rehydrate and popping aspirin. No cool pictures or stories for this day.

Day 2

Having learned my lesson, I returned to my usual pool-nerdiness and woke up early, had a light breakfast, and arrived at the pool room at 9:50 a.m., ten minutes before it was supposed to open. One of the waitresses, Amber, was there as well. She told me the room wasn't supposed to open until 10:30 a.m. -- did I want to go get coffee? Sure, why not. She drove the both of us to Starbucks and by the time we got back, the room was open.

I sh#t out one more time before reality kicked in and my two losses were 8-2 and 8-0. After an appropriate period of mourning and running away from well-meaning pity vultures, I turned

my attention back to the tournament as a spectator.

One of the most exciting finishes to a match happened on the B-side matchup of Ronnie Alcano and Jayson Shaw. I caught the latter half of the match and according to other spectators, the match had been hill-hill the whole way, with neither player taking more than a one-game lead over the other.

After the break in the hill game, the 9-ball rolled very close to the bottom left corner pocket. Both players took a crack at making the 9-ball on caroms. Alcano seemed to get the first solid opportunity, with an open shot on the 1-ball into the side and a one-rail carom into the 9-ball. He made the 1-ball, but missed the carom on the 9-ball. He was hooked on the 2-ball which was uptable, by the upper right side rail.

Mr. Aloha Kurt Kobayashi and I and all the spectators had been on our feet, food, drink, cigarettes, and significant others forgotten, saying nothing but "WHOA!" "HOLY CRAP!" "!!@&\$" for the last few shots and this one elicited the biggest groan so far.

Mr. Alcano shot rail-first and made the 2-ball (more "!!@&\$" from the audience) spinning the cue ball across the table to line up on the 3-ball which was facing the bottom left corner pocket - - where the 9-ball sat, waiting for the inevitable ("!!@&\$").

Mr. Alcano lined up the combination -- and rattled it, leaving the 3-ball sitting in the pocket and the 9-ball pushed off to side.

"WHOA!" "HOLY CRAP!" "!!@&\$"

Mr. Shaw ran out and thus avenged his first-round loss to Mr. Alcano.

I did not stay until the end because my crew and I had to get back home in order to resume our usual, less exciting lives on Monday.

I heard the final match was excellent, with Mr. Bustamante running a six-pack to win the first set (it was true double-elimination), 8-4 and then ultimately went on to win the tournament.

BCAPL Nationals Offers New Opportunities

New Leisure Division Added to Singles Lineup

Last summer CueSports International (CSI) announced that it will be adding a whole new singles division to the 37th (2013) BCAPL National Championships. With the move to the Rio All-Suite Hotel & Casino for the July 17-27, 2013 national event, the expanded space allows for more pool table and thus more play opportunities. The BCAPL has added the Leisure Men's and Leisure Women's Singles Divisions. Below are details and eligibility for these two new singles groups.

- Players who have played for 2 years in Open, Senior, or Super Senior (since 2005), and have never cashed in any Singles Division are eligible.
- Players may also be eligible if they have finished a full league session in the bottom half of their local league, and their league is enrolled on LeagueSys. We need LeagueSys to help research player history.
- Every player will be researched for player history. The eligibility criteria above do NOT insure playing in the new division. Known ability will be a big factor in establishing eligibility for this new division.
- Players entering the Leisure Division may also enter the 2nd Chance Singles events (if eligibility criteria are met), all mini tournaments, and much more.

The purpose of this division is to give lesser skilled players (called "B" players in some states) a level playing field against players of equal ability. For years, hundreds of players have participated in the Open division with no results. We greatly appreciate their support of the BCAPL and the BCAPL National Championships and wish to give them a fair chance to truly compete and cash among similarly skilled players.

If a player is unsure of his/her eligibility, he/she may send an email to Bill Stock, CSI Rules and Referee Director, requesting approval to enter the new Leisure Division: bill@playcsipool.com. Relocating the BCAPL National Championships to the larger Rio All-Suite Hotel & Casino, July 17-27, 2013, allows us to add this new division. We look at this as an opportunity to introduce more entry level pool players to "The Greatest Pool Tournament in the World!" This welcome addition demonstrates CSI's ongoing commitment to provide... More Choices for All Players.

Eligibility Expansion to Senior Divisions

The BCAPL (BCA Pool League) National Championships will be held July 17-27, 2013 for the first time at the Rio All-Suite Hotel & Casino, Las Vegas, Nevada. The move allowed the producer, CueSports International (CSI), to expand the overall group of events due to the addition of approximately one third more convention space than ever available before, but CSI is also able to expand some divisions. CSI announces that the BCAPL Men's Senior Singles, Men's Super Senior Singles and Women's Senior Singles will include the following eligibility changes:

MEN'S SENIOR SINGLES

A player that is senior age (55 years of age prior to the start date of an event) and also ranked as an Advanced player may participate in the Senior division but must spot an Open level player one game (6-5). Players that are senior age and rated as a Master or Grand Master are not eligible to participate in the senior's division. They must play in their appropriately rated division.

MEN'S SUPER SENIOR SINGLES

Men that turn 65 years of age prior to the tournament start date are eligible to participate in the Super Senior division. Regardless of a player's rating, if they are of Super Senior age they are eligible to participate. There is no handicap involved regardless of rating.

WOMEN'S SENIOR SINGLES

A player that is senior age (50 years of age prior to the start date of an event) and also ranked as an Advanced player may participate in the senior division but must spot an Open level player one game (5-4). Women that are senior age and rated as a Master or Grand Master are not eligible to participate in the senior division. They must play in their appropriately rated division.

THERE IS NO WOMEN'S SUPER SENIOR DIVISION. Women that turn 60 years of age prior to the tournament start date are eligible to participate in the Women's Senior division regardless of player rating.

As in the past, any senior age player may choose to play in the Open division if they are not rated as an Advanced, Master or Grand Master.

A Successful Visit From Varner & Hohmann, Made Possible by Str8 Shots

On March 23rd, despite the biggest snow storm of the year and highway closures, the Str8 Shots team and Felt Billiards staff gave a packed house of pool fans and players a warm place to spend their Saturday. The main event kicked off Saturday, March 23rd with a juniors qualifier tournament for the upcoming Junior Nationals, along with a \$500-added open event held alongside for the grown-ups. Even with the extreme weather conditions, the youth event boasted 30 players for the four divisions! The open event had been filled with 32 players days ago but was able to accept some waitlist entries with the weather keeping some players away.

Matches were paused for Varner and Hohmann's exhibition. The rails were four-people deep of spectators vying for their chance to challenge the pros. Players made a \$10 donation to the Billiard Education Foundation (BEF) for their shot at the two world champions who spent the next two hours taking challenge after challenge to help raise money. Finally, they broke for pizza with the kids and with a little daylight left, Hohmann borrowed a pair of winter gloves and stepped outside with the Str8 Shots crew to build a snowman.

The evening concluded with a Local Favorites vs. the World Champions challenge match up. Mark Haddad played Varner a race to 3 in one-pocket and Marc Vidal played a race to 11 of 10-ball against Hohmann. Both pros won their respective matches but not without a fight. Haddad got one game against Varner and Vidal lost 11-10 on the hill.

Overall, it was a memorable day that Colorado pool fans will be talking about for years. The BEF raised over \$1,600 and the kids of the Denver Junior Billiards League raised nearly \$800 for their

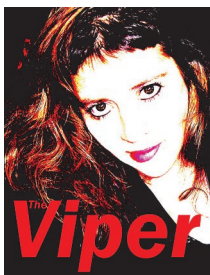

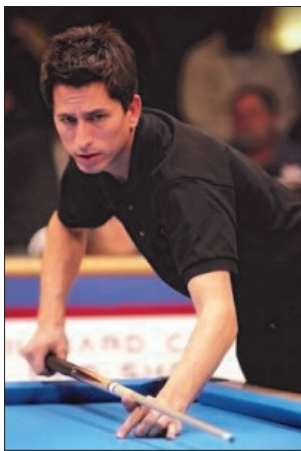

Stevie: Get a different perspective. Instruction is what helped me. Make sure the outside rows of balls are frozen from the head ball down to the corner balls.

Sometimes, that's just how it goes

I am thankful for all the support I had from people regarding my unexpected finish in this tournament. Those who know me and understand what I do in order to compete were happy to see my investment pay a dividend here. I did, however, have to field some interesting questions/statements/incidents from the usual well-meaning and sometimes clueless peeps. This is what I signed up for when I decided pool was the life for me.

End of Day 1 conversation -

You won two matches? Easy draw, eh?

Yes.

Whoa! How lucky are YOU today?

Lucky enough to be healthy enough to play pool -- so I'm this lucky almost every day.

Wow, you get a new cue? Is that why you're playing better?

No. I got a new arm.

No one expected YOU to get this far.

Thanks for the support.

Seriously, what are you doing different for your game these days?

Drinking too much the night before a tournament really brings out the best in my game.

End of Day 2 conversation -

You shouldn't be mad about losing to Stevie Moore.

Losing always sucks, regardless of whom I lose to.

You'd better get used to losing.

No. I won't. Because if one gets used to losing, one becomes a loser, no?

"Oh, sweetheart... come here!" [dude I DO NOT KNOW tries for a hug]

Screw this sh#t! [flees to women's restroom to hide for next 20 minutes from well-meaning pity vultures]

How does someone like you get this far in the tournament?!

Sometimes, that's just how it goes.

In addition, I had a guy follow me around the first day who kept telling me not to be afraid. Now, he might have been drunk, but I swear he made it his mission to try and get me to admit that I was afraid. Afraid of what? TSA to Allow Pool Cues as Carry Ons Once Again

WASHINGTON (AP) — Airline passengers will be able to carry small knives, souvenir baseball bats, golf clubs, *pool cues* and other sports equipment onto planes beginning next month under a policy change announced Tuesday by the head of the Transportation Security Administration.

The new policy conforms U.S. security standards to international standards, and allows TSA to concentrate its energies on more serious safety threats, the agency said in a statement.

The policy change was based on a recommendation from an internal TSA working group, which decided the items represented no real danger, said David Castelvetter, a spokesman for the agency.

The presence on flights of gun-carrying pilots traveling as passengers, federal air marshals and airline crew members trained in self-defense provide additional layers of security to protect against misuse of the items, he said. However, not all flights have federal air mar-

shals or armed pilots onboard.

The new policy permits folding knives with blades that are 2.36 inches or less in length and are less than 1/2-inch wide. The policy is aimed at allowing passengers to carry pen knives, corkscrews with small blades and other knives.

Passengers also will be allowed to bring onboard as part of their carry-on luggage novelty-sized baseball bats less than 24 inches long, toy plastic bats, pool cues, ski poles, hockey sticks, lacrosse sticks and two golf clubs, the agency said. **The policy goes into effect on April 25.**

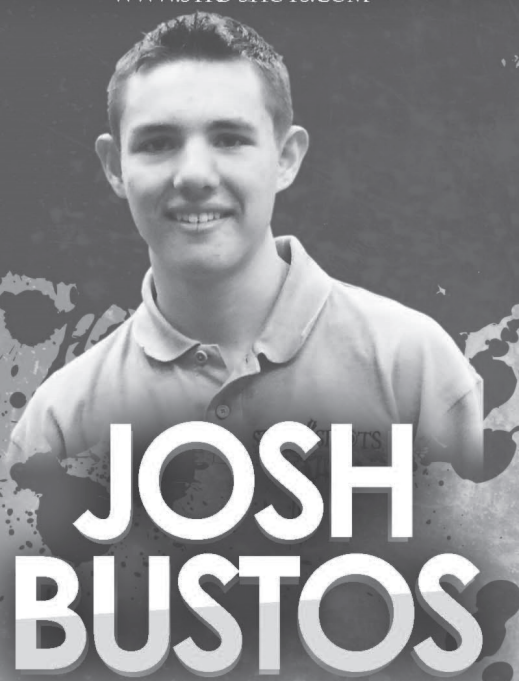
Security standards adopted by the International Civil Aviation Organization, a U.N. agency, already call for passengers to be able to carry those items. Those standards are non-binding, but many countries follow them.

Box cutters, razor blades and knives that don't fold or that have molded grip handles will still be prohibited, the TSA said.
