

Note from Editor: Due to an ongoing health issue, Tom will not be contributing new articles for awhile. For now, we will dip into his vast archives while he's on the mend. Please keep Tom in your thoughts and prayers.

At the conclusion of last month's column on speed control I mentioned briefly the importance of choosing an angle for the next shot to proceed from there to the following shot with manageable speed. That tidbit should not stand as something merely mentioned but begs for embellishment since many shots are missed because they force us to play outside the boundaries of controllable speed.

When you watch a professional playing great pool note how slight the variation in speed is for most shots as that player cleans up rack after rack. The reason is that he is paying close attention to the angle that he leaves for each shot in his position play. Each different game places its own, unique position demands on the player who is working to run a rack. Nine ball for example often requires the player to move the cue ball long distances to get to the next shot while a game with shot selection, such as eight ball or straight pool, typically offers sequences of balls that are grouped close together. An experienced player will employ different position strategies

for most shots in the different games leaving thinner cuts when he wants to move the cue ball without excessive speed and straighter angles when he wants to keep the cue ball close without bunting it.


I want to offer two exercises that will help

you learn to identify the angles that you need to play position with speeds in the range of control. First, find lag speed for the table on which you are playing. To find lag speed place the cue ball one and a half diamonds from the bottom rail in the center of the table. Now shoot it straight up to the top rail to come back and hit the bottom rail with enough speed to return to the spot from which you shot it. This is a comfortable shooting speed and a very solid reference.

For shot A place the object ball on the second diamond about a half-inch from the rail. Now, experiment with various angles until you find the spot for the cue ball from where you can pocket the ball with lag speed and move the cue ball one time across the table to hit the opposite side rail and rebound between a half-diamond and a full-diamond space to point Y. That angle should be near spot 1. Now find the angle from which lag speed works to pocket the ball and move the cue ball twice across the table to return and hit the first rail with the same half-to-fulldiamond rebound; that should be somewhere around spot 2. Then find the angle from which lag speed with a punch stroke works to pocket the ball and move the cue ball away from the rail be-

> tween a half-diamond full-diamond a space; that spot should be near 3. Set up each shot now and practice it with another ball in a place where you can play lag-speed position for it. You can progress further with the exercise by choosing other places for the cue ball to land and finding the angles that work to get to those places with lag speed.


> In shot B you will play the cue ball to the same place from various angles by altering your speed. Set up the shot as shown, marking the object ball about a half-inch from the rail and marking the five spots from where you will shoot. You can mark the target, X, by placing a sticky note there. Begin the exercise with the cue ball on the center spot in your group of five; pocket the object ball and roll the cue ball to the target. Repeat the shot until you are stopping the cue ball on the target consistent-Now do the same



from the two spots adjacent to the center spot. Although the slight changes in angle for the first three shots will require noticeable adjustments in speed, success on all three should come rather easily. Move the cue ball now to the spot closest to the rail and play the shot. You will find that from this almost-straight angle the shot requires considerable power, a strong, center-ball punch, to move the cue ball the short distance to the target. Is it easy for you to hit the target consistently from there? Move the cue ball now to the fifth spot and play the shot. From here the shot requires an extremely soft hit to keep the cue ball from passing the target. Is that soft hit easy to control?

The last two shots in the second exercise illustrate the control problems that accompany shots played near the upper and lower limits of speed. Imagine the power shot four feet from the pocket on a tight table. Does that sound like an invitation to a miss? Now imagine the bunt shot from a few feet farther away on a strange table with dirty balls. Many great players would not attempt it fearing a bad roll or a skid. In either case though it's possible to find yourself with no other options after leaving the cue ball in such a difficult position.

As you learn the angles that move the cue ball to your desired position with comfortable speed you will begin to see them in your play. Seeing them immediately or without looking closely for them can only come from years of experience. Although the professional may not appear to check each shot carefully to find the angle he wants for the next ball, he still identifies it for every shot. If you must look carefully at the next ball to find the angle you want for it take the time to do that before shooting. Then look for rapid improvement in your game as you begin performing in the context of playing position to shoot with manageable speed.

Idea #1: "Bank the 1-ball in the corner pocket!"

Idea #2: "Play safe by trying to put the 2-ball between the cue ball and 1-ball!" Why aren't these the best ideas?


Idea #1: It is very unlikely that you will pocket this ball and if you miss, your penalty is huge. You will most likely sell out and your opponent will win especially with the 9-ball hanging in the jaws and the 2-ball is so close to it that you will probably leave them an easy combo or carom.


Idea #2: This is a better idea than Idea #1 but why do that when you could easily win the game right now?

Answer:

This is an easy follow shot. Just set up the cue ball on a straight line through the 1-ball and 9-ball, hit will high English and pocket the 9-ball and win!

It's Just You and the Game By OMG

Question from the masses...

For a tournament like the US Bar Table Championship, where you have an option to either participate in the Open Division, with the best players, or the women's division, which would you choose?

I recently had some conversations with guys who are around my level, but always have to play the open division. On the one hand it may be an advantage to have a better chance of going deep in the tournament (and cash out), but I wonder if the men are getting the kind of experience to make them tougher competitors. I'd feel kind of like a jack-ass being a crummy player AND a woman, and entering the open division, even though I kind of want to. (I didn't play at all this year... but thinking ahead).

Anyway, curious what your perspective is?

My goodness. These kind of questions make me polish my monocle thoughtfully in a dignified manner before I luxuriously crack my knuckles and start banging away at the keyboard like a caffeinated kindergartener in my eagerness to address the many facets of this social-commentary diamond.

Do go on...

I should be delicate when discussing Men vs Women in Pool, but I'm about as tactful as a rhinoceros made of sledgehammers. How about I just make a sweeping generalization: Most, if not all, of us look at the Women's division as being easier to win than the Open division. Men currently dominate the upper echelons of the game. There are more men players and they, as a group, have played pool much longer than women. It follows, then, that the Open/Men's division will have more players and more higher-skilled players than the Women's division. Let's take a look at the numbers.

This year at the U.S. Bar Table Championships, the Open 8-ball division had 205 entrants. The Women's division had 55. The Open division raced to five games, the Women's to four. First place paid out \$6,000 for the Open and \$1,175 for the Women. Numbers show these two divisions are very different. Numbers do not show how these two divisions are the same.

You wonder: Are the men getting the kind of experience to make them tougher competitors?

I answer: They are not receiving any kind of experience that is not also available to you.

Here's the doozy: WE decide what kind of experience makes us tougher competitors.

I have played in both women's and open tourna-

ments. I have won one significant women's tournament. I have never won a significant open tournament, although I have placed well on rare occasion. I could not tell you if the women's tournament win is equal to placing high in an open tournament because there is no way to compare the two quantitatively. Even more interesting, I could not tell you which finish was more difficult to accomplish.

While there are exceptions (like some dang world champion getting frisky and running the set out from the break), I would say the player is in control of his or her actions which contribute to the match outcome. It is just you and the game, not who you play or what kind of tournament you are in

You can learn something from every match you play.

It is not important what kind of competition you play in or who you compete against. What is important is that you go out and compete. Compete as much as you can. Compete with yourself in practice. Strive to improve all aspects of your game. Just because a tournament has only women players does not mean it has less experiential/educational value than an open tournament. You are the one in control of your learning curve.

APA Awards More than \$500,000 In Cash and Prizes at the 2013 National Singles Championships

World's Largest Pool League Crowns Seven Amateur Champions in Las Vegas

More than \$500,000 in cash and prizes were awarded to APA members at the APA National Singles Championships held April 24 – 27 in Las Vegas at the Riviera Hotel & Casino. The National Singles Championships consisted of both the 8-Ball Classic and 9-Ball Shootout Singles Championships, the Wheelchair Challenge and the Jack & Jill Doubles Championship.

The final round of the 9-Ball Shootout featured three championship matches, one for each Skill Level Tier, with two shooters in each match competing for \$10,000 in cash and prizes.

In the Green Tier, Tom Williamson of Billerica, Mass., defeated Cheri Schroth of Murfreesboro,

Tenn. Williamson advanced to the finals after a semi-final round victory over Kathy Tingler of Tyler, Texas. Schroth ad-

How Did Our Regional Qualifiers Do at the APA National Singles Championship?

Players from around Colorado converged on Colorado Springs the first weekend in March to compete in the 2013 APA Rocky Mountain Singles Regional. On the line were precious few coveted spots in the APA National 8-Ball or 9-Ball Singles Championships to be held at the Riviera Hotel and Casino in Las Vegas.

The tournament featured over 100 players competing in their respective skill level brackets in both 8-Ball and 9-Ball. The 8-Ball event offers four skill level tiers: Blue Tier (SL 2&3), Yellow Tier (SL 4), Red Tier (SL 5), and Purple Tier (SL 6&7). The champion in each tier at the national event receives \$15,000 in cash and prizes with a total purse of over \$280,000.

The 9-Ball Event offers three skill level tiers: Green Tier (SL 1-3), White Tier (SL 4&5) and Black Tier (SL 6-9). The champion in each tier at the National event receives \$10,000 in cash and prizes with a total purse of over \$150,000. Colorado players faired well at this year's National Championships. 





An Interview with Top Ranked American Player Vivian Villarreal



This month I am introducing you to one of the best players on the planet and she was born right in the heart of Texas.

The Interview:

Viper: Where were you born? Tornado: San Antonio, Texas

Viper: Do you have siblings?


Tornado: I have 2 half brothers and a half sister. I'm an only child.

Viper: What did your parents think of your pool career?

Tornado: My mom at first wasn't too happy with it, but eventually she realized I had talent. Both my parents felt I could be number #I in the world. It turned out they were both so right!

Viper: When you were younger, who did you look up to?

Tornado: I looked up to my father. He passed away May 4th, 2008 and it completely changed my life. I miss him dearly and there is not one day that goes by that I don't think of him.



Tornado: China because they are so disciplined with their athletes. They recruit them from a very young age to where all they do is study in school and practice constantly. Unbelievable athletes! Why do you think they do so well in the Olympics?

Viper: Who's your favorite female pool player? Tornado: Lol... Well, I have to say me!! I don't have one.

Viper: Where and when did you first start playing pool?

Tornado: At Mollie's Lounge in San Antonio, TX. It was my grandmother's bar. I started hitting the balls at the age of 8 years old, standing on a milk carton. Back in the day, my dad was a really good pool player and when I was 8-years old he began to teach me.

Viper: What are your biggest accomplishments in the sport of billiards? Tornado: My goal was to be #1 in the world and I stayed there for about 5 years. Also, when I won the ESPN World Championships.

Viper: Do you currently have any sponsors?

Tornado: My sponsors are "The Coaster Fan" and soon I will announce additional information.

Viper: Did you ever play in a pool league? Tornado: No I never played in any league.

Viper: Are you good at any other sports?

Tornado: I've always been a great athlete. I can play basketball well, volleyball, table tennis and in golf, I'm ok.

Viper: Describe yourself in three words? Tornado: *Crazy, funny and fearless.*

Viper: If you had to live your life over again, what one thing would you change about yourself and/or your pool career?

Tornado: I wouldn't change anything at all. I'm very blessed to travel the world because of my talent.

Viper: How do you prepare for events?

Tornado: I try and play local tournaments. I practice about 2 hours in the morning and 2 hours in the evening. It's so convenient when you have a table at home.

Viper: What was the best advice you were ever given?

Tornado: Minnesota Fats once told me don't ever play with a loose bridge and approach the table with confidence.

Viper: What is one thing that you enjoy most while playing pool?

Tornado: Oh, my fans!! I love when they interact with me and do the twirl when I win. My fans have always giving me the motivation to be the best.

Viper: If you could say one thing to a young up-coming player what would it be?

Tornado: To stay focused, practice hard and play hard.

Viper: What's your Favorite game?

Tornado: I like all the games actually. It helps your game I feel.

Ok Vivian, here are some Facebook questions...

Pauline McGrath from Saco, Maine asks: Vivian are you married and do you have any children?

Tornado: I am not married... and I am not crazy. LOL! I have two children that I have raised and their names are Nathalie Garcia 20 years old and GianCarlo Ornelas 9 years old.

Ben Roberts from Hutchinson, KS asks: Vivian is so enthusiastic, does she ever rush her shots because of it??

Tornado: That is just my style... its part of my personality.

Josh Soneathit Souvannakasy from Anchorage, Alaska asks: How did you get the nickname the Texas tornado?

Tornado: I was in Chicago and Mark Haddad, who worked for Billiards Digest, kept making wind-like noises from the audience while I was playing in a pool match against Robin Dodson. I kept hushing him and he yelled - out loud, "I hear a funnel cloud coming and wow it's like a storm". He called me the Texas Tornado and that's how I got the nickname.

Monica Campbell from Poplar, MT asks: When you did go pro, how long was it before you placed in final 16 then final 8?

Tornado: I turned pro in 1991. I went from unranked to #1 in a matter of 14 months and I stayed there for about 5 years.

Brian Clapp from San Jose, CA asks: Who was your toughest opponent...do you prefer tournaments or money matches?

Tornado: My toughest opponent has always been the pool table and myself. I play better for the money but I enjoy both.

Geoffrey Quezada from Arvada, CO asks: How do you get out of a slump?

Tornado: You have to overcome your mistakes and move forward because if you knew that you could play perfect all the time, then you wouldn't be challenged. When I get home from a tournament, I try and remember my mistakes. I sit back and think what I could have done differently or why I missed it. I practice the shot until I feel satisfied it's been corrected.

Chris Honeman from Conifer, CO asks: What, in your opinion, is the key to achieving your highest potential as a pool player?

Tornado: I set goals when I was younger to become #1 and become a world champion and I accomplished them. To this day I continue to set personal goals.

Brandon Flynn from Durant, OK asks: What was your worst loss?

Tornado: It was at the US Open in 2008. I was playing a TV match against Kelly Fisher and it was tied at 6-6 and I was shooting an easy 8-ball to win the match. I took my eye off the ball and missed it! I was in complete disbelief and lost the match behind it. As soon as I left the arena, I tried to call my dad to comfort me and the phone just rang and rang and that's when I realized he was truly gone. When I broke out in tears, my WPBA sisters tried to console me and that's one event I will never forget.

Okay, enough pontificating. I am sure my point has been made (with the subtlety of sledgehammerrhinoceroses). I have to answer your question(s).

Which would you choose given the option: Women's or Open tournament?

Isn't it unfair women can play in women's and open tournaments but men only have open tournaments?

No. Men have been playing pool far longer than women. They have 400 years on the wire. If we get two avenues of competition, it's because we need them both in order to catch up. Once we've caught up, then we can get rid of separate divisions and just be one unified competitive, bloodthirsty, glory-mongering family.

All those words above were put there to tell you this: Play whatever you want to play. No one competitive situation is worth more or less than another. Don't let people (or your own guilt) badger you into playing or not playing in a tournament. If you cannot play in everything you want (that's, like, 99.9% of us), then make the best decision for your situation and commit fully to that decision. You are not a jack-ass, woman, or crummy player. You are a player, period.


