Note from Editor: Due to an ongoing health issue, Tom will not be contributing new articles for awhile. For now, we will dip into his vast archives while he's on the mend. Please keep Tom in your thoughts and prayers.

### February 2001

Some great people are remembered most for the impressions they leave with us just before or immediately after they depart this world. If the legend of Oscar Wilde's last words is the truth, that utterance alone ensures his immortality for me. Some live on for their epitaphs; Groucho Marx comes first to mind for his. If someone can write honestly on my headstone, "He mastered the stop shot," I am sure to rest peacefully.

Now that we have our goals laid out let's get to work. There is an aspect of position play so fundamental to controlling the cue ball's track off of the object ball that the term associated with it has taken root in every player's vocabulary. I fear that as the words "tangent line" become a cliché their meaning and, more important, their understanding will dissipate for some players. We dis-

cussed the concept here almost three years ago and shall review in order to simplify our understanding and clear up any misconceptions.

I worry that the term "tangent line" may


confuse some players since a circle or sphere has an infinite number of lines tangent to it meaning that any track traced by the cue ball after contact can be defined as tangent to the object ball. Call it what you wish as long as you have a clear picture of what is meant. We wouldn't want such an important concept to go the way of the word "stun," which now has a stunning number of different meanings in billiards parlance.

Look at the shot in the diagram below and note the line drawn perpendicular to the line of the object ball into the pocket. Set up the shot with the cue ball at point A, mark the positions of the balls and draw that perpendicular line lightly with the chalk. Now shoot the shot to pocket the ball and keep the cue ball on that line. Shoot the shot repeatedly while altering speed, stroke, and the spot

you hit on the cue ball and noting where the cue ball tracks for each shot. You will find that only one shot keeps the cue ball on the perpendicular line, the stop shot. It may be a firm stop shot hit just below the center of the cue ball or a soft one hit down near the bottom but only a stop shot will keep the cue ball on that line. If you need to nail down your stop shot for this distance move the cue ball to point B to make the shot straight and shoot some stop shots from there at different speeds.

Move the cue ball back to point A and consider the shot for a minute. Why is there so much talk surrounding the so-called tangent line when it accounts for only one cue-ball track among so many possibilities? Because so many shots offer such a daunting number of choices, players desire certainty especially when under a little pressure. A precise knowledge of where the cue ball will track is extremely powerful and knowing that one specific shot, the shot that you've mastered, will yield that track every time is very reassuring. While studying the shot further consider how many places on the table you can leave the cue ball by playing the perpendicular track and changing only speed.



# Facebook Questions to "The Viper"

This month's feature reflects a selection of pool-related questions asked by my Facebook friends.

### Shane/New Iberia, LA

In 8-ball what is better, to break from the rail or in the box?

**Viper:** Shane, I play so much 9-ball using the Magic rack that I am very used to breaking the balls from the rail. So, naturally I start off from there but if I find that I am not making balls on the break then I start moving my cue ball towards the center of the table to try and find the table's sweet-spot.

Although, in 8-ball I break using the "Second-ball cut break", in which I use a little inside-draw striking the second ball of the rack with medium speed. Be careful not to scratch! © No matter what though, before your match, it's important to not just practice running balls but to also include practicing the break to find the best spot to break from during your match.

### Hector Otani/San Antonio, TX

Does working out, as in weights or biking affect your stroke?

**Viper:** Hector, I can't answer for all pros but when I was younger I hired a personal trainer that did not know that I played professional pool for a living. He had me working out with weights three-times a week and after a while I noticed that I was muscling the ball around the table like I was the Incredible Hulk! It was funny at the time but I had to learn the hard way and immediately stopped!

Later in the my career, I met a personal trainer at the Denver Athletic Club, while being the house pro there, who really helped me develop a workout routine built just for me as a pool player. He had me doing a lot of cardio and most of all he got me into Yoga/Pilates classes. These classes really helped me out with the mental part of the game as well, so I definitely suggest going to your local gym and trying one of these classes out!

# Morne Du Toit/Lichtenburg, North-West, South Africa

Is there a way to break 'properly' and if there is, how is it done?

**Viper:** Morne, what's important about the break is pocketing a ball and controlling the cue ball. Your cue ball never lies, it always tells the truth! So if you have a powerfully strong break and pocket three balls but lose control of your cue ball by scratching then you obviously need to work on better control.

If you control your cue ball and never pocket a ball then you need to move your cue ball around until you do pocket a ball on the break. And most of all, what helped me with my break was by reading/watching some books/DVD called "Racking Secrets" by pro player Joe Tucker. Go to his website: www.joetucker.net for more details and he even has some free videos that might help out.



# Jimneezy Johnson/Vallejo, CA

How can one master the use of inside English?

**Viper:** Jimneezy, when I teach my classes, I explain to my students that any English is like the dark side of pool...lol! It's very difficult to apply, use, and master.

Let me share a little secret about position, the only reason why you should apply English is to create something that does not exist and that isn't a natural angle! In the fantasy world of playing perfect pool, it's best to always leave yourself a natural angle for your next shot! But in the real world of pool that doesn't always happen...If you're straight in on a shot and need to get position on a ball that is on the opposite side of the table then you would need to use right hand English to get the ball to travel to the right.

Just an FYI -- To me, using topspin, center, or draw is not really using English because you're still shooting on a straight-line. I imagine using a clock system for applying English. For example, looking at the cue ball, 1pm-5pm is used for right-hand English and 7pm-11pm is used for applying left-hand English. And just a rule of thumb, most of the time you're only using the circumference size of a nickel to apply English on the cue ball.

On top of this basic information, there are tons of free videos on YOUTUBE and multiple books out there that can help explain English in more depth.

# Sometimes, That's Just How It Goes By OMG

Not too long ago, I was told there was a spot available at the Women's Professional Billiards Association's 2012 U.S. Open 9-Ball Championships. When I got The Call for the open spot, I did not react the way I thought I would.

I knew that if the WPBA was calling me, they must have a shortage of players. I am not nearly qualified enough to play in these events and I hadn't done well enough in regional events as of late to justify an invite to their biggest event of the year (or at least it was the last time I was actively chasing the Tour). In order for me to be called, there must have been a significant number who turned down their invites.

Knowing I was the scrapings at the bottom of the barrel did not stop me from having the itch to play. So, I, like any person besotted with noble visions of glory, said, "Why the hell not." Cheers to bad decisions.

The tournament started on Wednesday (players' meeting) with play starting on Thursday. I got the call on Thursday, May 31, and would have to be at the venue in Tulsa by June 6. That was less than a week. By the way, when I got the call I was told I needed to pay the \$500 entry fee plus the \$150 registration fee, like, RIGHT

NOW. I could pay it tomorrow (I'm not one of those people who has \$650 just lying around like so many used tissues). I was told that was fine.

Then I was told I was not guaranteed a spot after all and had to wait until someone ahead of me in line had declined the invite.

Okay, that's just weird. Don't call me and have me sell off blood and ramen futures until YOU are SURE I can play, y'know? Jeez. The next day, I had the money ready, but was still put on hold. Whatever. When finally I got the go ahead, I sent the money and then turned to the logistics of time, travel, and expenses.

In order for me to ask for time off from work with so little advance notice, I had to do what I really, really, REALLY did not want to do: I had to tell my boss why I needed the time off. I don't like telling people at work what I do outside of work. I certainly don't like telling them about pool or how far gone down the rabbithole of billiards I am because it inevitably piques people's curiosities and I AM NOT the person who likes to satisfy their (often inane and Color-Of-Moneyesque) queries. I got the time off but it would be unpaid. Also, I had to finish all projects before leaving. Okay. Now the mission

was to get to Tulsa without breaking the bank.

When you have less than seven days' notice to fly halfway across the country during a time when fuel costs are quite high and you have to check in your cues, flying becomes a luxury. I could not find a round-trip flight to Tulsa for less than a thousand dollars. Uh, no. That is not going to happen. Furthermore, the host hotel was \$100+ per night. Ugh. When possible, players are to stay at the host hotel. Great.

After some planning and A Little Help From My Friends, this is the plan I came up with:

- Greyhound to Tulsa (because it was waaaay cheaper than flying)
- Stay at the cheapest hotel I can find within a reasonable distance (if I was fined for this -- oh well, "check's in the mail")
- Fly home (I still had more than 7 days before the day of departure and I HAD to get back to work because, you know, I'm a working stiff and not a pool player)

I would leave Tuesday morning and hopefully, after 33 hours, I would be in Tulsa in time for the players' meeting.



# Four 8-Ball Teams Qualify for Vegas





# **Breaks Can Be Deceiving**



In the infant stages of my pool game, I was constantly reminded of the importance of practice and repetition. I was building muscle memory and honing my skills. If I went for more than one day without prac-

ticing, I could feel my game suffer. It seemed like I was taking an immediate step back and in some cases would even need to relearn things.

Of course, I never minded playing and practicing so much in the beginning because I was obsessed. I put in the hours because I was falling in love with the game. The breaks were seldom, by design.

These days, as I've improved and my skills and knowledge advanced, I find myself practicing for longer sessions but with less frequency. Let's face it, there comes a point where your priorities shift and "life" keeps you from putting in the hours that you were once accustomed to.

Over the past year, whenever I've taken a break, I've returned to the table renewed. I've found

myself pocketing balls just as well or better than I was prior to the time off.

Does this mean it's not necessary to practice on a regular basis anymore? What's the point of practicing if I'm playing just as well without it? The two main factors that infrequent practice affects are confidence and consistency.

Playing well after a long break can be deceiving for a couple reasons:

- 1. When you're playing well without practicing, you fool yourself into thinking you don't need to practice. You may be able to get away with it once or twice but over time, that lack of practice will accumulate and
  - take its toll on your overall ability to execute. With waivered confidence, tentative shots and decisions will lead to repeated mistakes and vice versa.
- 2. Playing well without practicing gives you a false sense of security. You might start hitting the balls well and feeling like you're ready for competition. It's only then when your abilities are put to the test that you realize you're pocketing balls on autopilot. Once you get to the money ball or key ball, that's

when the inconsistency surfaces. Routine run outs become more work than they should be.

Confidence is so critical in the game of pool. If ever you tell yourself you're out of stroke, then you'll be out of stroke. You may be hitting the ball well but you will still be a bit rusty. The next time you return from a break, try to still play with confidence but do not be deceived. Be aware of your limitations and play within them. Until you get back in stroke, take fewer risks and be more patient.

As it turned out, I arrived in Tulsa after 36 hours on various buses.

Unfortunately, I had arrived too late to take the public bus system to my hotel so I hailed a taxi. When I got in, I told him to go to my hotel, the Tulsa Select. He turned around and asked why I was going there. Because it's my hotel, I said. He considered this for a moment and then told me the Tulsa Select was a hotel well-known to contain hookers and drug dealers and most cabdrivers would be wary of picking up from that hotel after dark for fear of getting robbed. I said I was neither a hooker nor a drug dealer and that it was my hotel and that was where I needed to go. I thought the driver was being overly sensationalistic.

When I got to the hotel, I found out the driver was at least half-right. The place was a complete dump. # What Would a Sucker Do? If you look around and don't see any suckers ... YOU are the sucker!






Do you want to win or are you content to just hit balls around at random? If you want to win, you must play the odds. Skilled players understand the chances of pocketing their ball versus the likelihood of executing a successful safety, while also assessing the cost and benefit of each option.

My next series of articles will be a sample of what we go over in my Billiards Boot Camp held here in Northern California. In the graphic below, you have stripes. Your opponent's ball is in the jaws and

the 8-ball is on the opposite end rail. What do you do? A sucker would attempt a low-percentage bank shot on the stripe and, if successful, be rewarded with ANOTHER low-percentage bank or thin cut on the 8 ball. The skilled player would pocket their opponent's ball in the corner with a combination shot, leaving the opponent a tough bank shot and leaving your ball in the jaws. Now it is almost impossible for them to play safe on you, and they are now forced to attempt a low-percentage bank shot. You are now the favorite to win this game.

Play the shot in the diagram now to track the cue ball on the perpendicular line at various speeds. Observe where the cue ball lands after every shot. Work on your low, soft stop shot to track the cue ball along the line with just enough speed to get to the short rail. Can you add speed and use this track to move the cue ball two rails to the center of the table? Can you add more speed to move the cue ball through the center of the table for a good shot on a ball lying at point X? For that position try a firm stop shot with a touch of outside english, right in this case. Does that affect the cue ball's track? You will find that when you use english and maintain your punch stroke, the english will not move the cue ball off of the perpendicular line. Play for the ball at point X with just a little outside english to move the cue ball into position without excessive speed. Get comfortable with using english in this way, just enough to give you a natural roll off of the two rails, and find the right speed to land on at least five separate, precise points along the entire path.

You can reflect on your work now and consider two important results. Note how comfortable the perpendicular track can feel and how many possibilities are at your disposal when you choose it. Set up and play other shots with the same technique as you predict and observe the possible outcomes. Watch the best players and note how often they choose the track and reliable punch stroke that you are mastering today. You may be amazed by how frequently you see successful position resulting from one consistent choice.
