Note from Editor: Due to an ongoing health issue, Tom will not be contributing new articles for awhile. For now, we will dip into his vast archives while he's on the mend. Please keep Tom in your thoughts and prayers.

### March 2001

Last month we discussed what is called the tangent line and practiced hitting it consistently. Now that you have the stop shot mastered and can hit one at any time, any distance and any speed we can work on a technique for making small adjustments to the track that the stop shot yields.

What makes the stop shot the foundation for position play is the certainty of its result, whether you employ it to stop the cue ball on a straight-in shot or to hit the perpendicular track on a cut shot. That certainty makes the stop shot a very powerful tool and reliable reference to plan position for the next shot. Part of my routine when studying many shots for position on the next ball is to begin with the question, "will a stop shot work here"? When the answer is no,

what's often required is something very close to the result that the stop shot would yield. These are the situations where the stop shot works as a strong reference.

Suppose you are faced with a layout where the perpendicular track would take you to the next ball except for the fact that it is blocked by an obstructing ball or perhaps it leads to a scratch. Here you need a track different from the one you have mastered but close to it. You can approach a situation like this with confidence because what is required is so closely related to what you have mastered.

Set up the shot in the diagram and begin with the cue ball at point A. From there hit some stop shots with firm speed just below center on the cue ball. When you feel that you can

stop the cue ball every time at this distance you can begin to make some small adjustments to the shot. Set up to shoot the stop shot again then move your tip slightly higher on the cue ball for some forward movement; as little as an eighth of an inch may be enough to make the cue ball move forward after hitting the object ball. Play the shot in this way until you are consistently moving the cue ball forward no more than four inches despite the firm speed. Repeat the shot now with a similar downward adjustment on the cue ball until you are moving the cue ball backwards from the object ball, again no more than a few inches. Some players call this stun follow and stun draw. Try the shots a couple of times with soft follow and soft draw and compare those attempts to the stun shots to see which are easier to control for such slight cue-ball movement. Probably you will find that the stun shots are easier to control and more reliable.



# The Return of... WWPD? (What Would the Pros Do?) Vol. 4

In the recent 2011 Mosconi Cup in Las Vegas, Nevada, the Americans suffered a loss to the Europeans in part due to skillful

maneuvers like this one...

In the fourth match of the series, US scotch doubles team of Shane Van Boening and Mike Dechaine faced the European team of Darren Appleton and Ralf Souquet in a race to six games of 9-ball. Out of the gate, Van Boening/Dechaine jumped to a quick 4-0 lead but would ultimately not win another game.

After edging their way back into the match, Appleton/Souquet pulled into the lead and onto the hill 5-4 when Souquet came with this clutch shot to secure their victory. When Appleton came up just shy of where we he intended to be on a draw shot for position, Souquet was faced with an interesting layout to get from the 4 ball to the 6 ball.

Let's review his options:

A. He could've tried to play a safety, banking the 4 ball and tucking the cue ball behind the 6. This is tricky to execute with perfection. Souquet, also known as "The Surgeon" doesn't shoot many low percentage shots without being able to predict the outcome. If he didn't believe he could marry that cue ball to the back side of

the 6 ball, he wasn't willing to take the risk. It also wouldn't be certain where the 4 ball would end up or if it or something else might incidentally get pocketed. Therefore, he decided it wasn't worth the risk.


B. He could've pocketed the 4 ball with extreme leftdraw to clip the 6 ball. This is what most amateur players

would attempt to do, not realizing there is too much angle to make this possible. In an effort to move that 6 ball, many players miss the 4 ball. It's also extremely easy to miss this shot on the professional Diamond tables if it's not shot well.

C. Though Souquet was left with a fairly

steep cut shot on the 4 ball, it didn't take him long to identify that position was built in. If he just pockets the 4 ball with a center ball punch stroke, the natural path of the cue ball would travel between the 7 and 9 back to the other side of the 6 ball. The only thing he needed to consider here would be his speed.

On this shot, it's critical to aim to overcut the 4 ball. It's possible to slightly undercut this ball where it grazes the short rail and still goes in but this would dramatically change the path of the cue ball and send it toward the 7 ball, flirting with disaster. When executing a shot like this, it's important to have a clear plan and when it's time to pull the trigger, visualize the exact outcome you want to achieve.



This match victory would put team Europe ahead 3-1 and help give them the momentum needed to claim the championship. The 2012 PartyPoker.com Mosconi Cup will be held December 10-13 in York Hall, London. Check out matchroompool.com for all the coverage and highlights.



# An Interview with Colorado's Legendary Player Danny Medina

Danny Medina was born on September 10, 1951 in Taos, NM. He started playing pool at the age of 14 in a little town called Brighton, Colorado. His extensive career brought him over 73 titles across the USA and his most memorable ones are the following:

**1984 -** NPCA Championships in Chicago, IL - Beat Florida's professional David Howard in the finals.

**1986** - Disneyland Open Championships in Anaheim, CA – Beat David Howard in the finals by running eight-racks of 9-ball in a row to capture the title.

**1986** - Corner Pockets of America in Las Vegas, NV - Beat David Howard for a third time in a row to win the championships.

**1997 -** BCA World 8-ball Open Championships at the Riviera Hotel and Casino in Las Vegas, NV – Beat Efren Reyes in the finals 7-5.

**2002** - Jamboree 1-Pocket Open at Hard Times in Sacramento, CA – Beat Cliff Joiner in the finals to win the title.

**2004** - Reno Open 9-Ball Championships in Reno, NV – Beat Cory Duel in the finals 8-5 twice to win the title.

# The Interview

# VIPER: What is your biggest accomplishment in the sport of billiards?

DANNY: In 1997, I became the #1 ranked player on the Camel Pro Billiards Tour.

### VIPER: Did you ever play in a pool league?

DANNY: In 1970, I started playing in a local pool league here in Denver that had started with 25 teams. By the time I retired in 1971 they had over 40 teams competing. I retired from the amateur levels to pursue my professional career.

# VIPER: Where do you draw your inspiration?

DANNY: I won the Colorado State Marble Championships in 1964 at the age 12 and for winning that event I also won a trip to Washington DC to meet the President, Lyndon B. Johnson. While there in DC I also got the opportunity to place flowers on JFK's grave.

During the marble championships they had 97 players and the top 2 got to go on the DC trip. Here at home, I won a nice trophy, a \$1500 new wardrobe, a 10-speed bike, and a watch that I still have with 21 jewels.

When I was 14 years old, I worked at a local grocery store making \$120 per week. And one day I walked into a pool hall named Brighton Billiards and lost my entire paycheck playing a game called "Golf" on a 5 x 10 Snooker table. Marbles and pool are so similar that I knew that one day, I could master both games. But for pool it took me a little longer than I then I expected.

### VIPER: Are you good at any other sports?

DANNY: I played tennis in high school, worked at a golf range when I was a kid, and competed in archery at the Denver coliseum. I also was very good at basketball, wrestling, and baseball.

## VIPER: Describe yourself in three words?

Honest, loyal, and Christian - A man of faith.

VIPER: If you had to live your life over again, what's the one thing you would change about your self or your career?

DANNY: Nothing

# VIPER: Who influenced you the most in pool?

DANNY: Buddy Hall, hands down was my favorite... It's like he could pick up the cue ball and place it anywhere he wanted for the next shot.

Jean Balukas would be my second pick. In 1988, I was playing in an event hosted at the Continental hotel in Lexington, KY. The night before the tournament I ran into Keith McCready who was playing a feature match against Jean Balukas the following day.

He started bragging on how he was gonna beat her real bad. So, the next day, I watched their match and right out of the gate Jean broke and ran the first 5 racks on him. She ended up winning the match 11-2.

After that I tried to watch as many of her matches as I could. I was tantalized by how strong she was... She broke the balls like a man. Its obvious that she was very athletic and I heard she liked to run and play tennis. To this day, I have never witnessed a woman play like her

# VIPER: Who were your favorite professionals?

BCA Hall of famers Jean Belukas, Buddy Hall, and Jay Helfert who is currently a TV commentator and Writer/Author of "Pool Wars". Jay loved pool so much that at times he'd put up his own money just to watch us win it ©

## VIPER: How did you prepare for events?

DANNY: 30 days or so I would start exercising—I walked my treadmill, I swam a lot, and of course practiced long hours by playing the ghost. I could never beat that dang ghost, but once I came close losing 11-7.

# VIPER: What was the best advice you were ever given?

DANNY: Legendary Willie Mosconi once told me: Don't do drugs and be honest to yourself about your game.

# VIPER: What is one thing that you enjoy most while playing pool?

DANNY: When I played in the finals of the 2004 Reno Open I broke and ran 9-racks in a row and didn't even know it! After the match it wasn't until Billy Incardona and Buddy Hall approached me to tell me what I had accomplished. They said the proof was on the film during the TV round.

Another event, I pocketed the 9-ball on the break 5-times in a row, in two consecutive matches; the first set was against Billy Johnson and the other was against Mary Kenningston. I won both matches  $11-5 \odot$ 

# VIPER: If you could say one thing to a young up-coming player what would it be?

DANNY: Practice and exercise.... and practice more and exercise more.

Ok Danny, now I have a couple of pool related questions from my Facebook friends...

# Brian Clapp from San Jose, CA asks: What is the most money you've ever won in a night & who was the toughest match you ever played against?

DANNY: Are you from the IRS Brian? I made so much money, so many times that I couldn't even try and count it.

The toughest player I've ever played against was Efren Reyes. I played him 10-ball money match in Houston and won the first 3 games for \$500 a game and before I knew it, he caught a gear and some how ended up 7 games ahead-that was all the money I had so I had to quit \$3500 loser.

The next event, I flew to Reno and we matched up again but this time we played 9-ball for \$200 a game and I ended up 9- games ahead and he quit. Efren was the toughest and most intense opponents I've ever played against in my career.



Now move the cue ball to point B and play some stop shots to keep the cue ball on the perpendicular track. After you are hitting that track consistently you can place another object ball on the track as an obstruction. With the obstructing ball in place employ the technique described for stun follow and play some shots to track the cue ball below the obstructing ball for a shot on a ball at point X. Now, play some stun-draw shots to track the cue ball above the obstruction for a shot on a ball at point Y. Try this shot a few times

as a regular draw shot and note how easy it to scratch in the opposite side pocket while the stun draw insures against that possibility.

The shots you are working on today are extremely powerful tools because they offer a very reliable method for taking control over some of the numerous possibilities and challenges that will show up in a pool match. As you master the stop shot you will master the techniques for adjusting it to hit other precise tracks. From such practice you will gain a new level of confidence as you begin to recognize how often what is required is the same as what you know.

# In a Legendary Epic Thriller, Darren Appleton Wins the World 9-Ball Championship

(Doha, Qatar)--In one of the most thrilling and surreal finals ever witnessed in pool history, England's Darren Appleton won the 2012 World 9-ball Championship, barely beating China's Lee He Wen, 13-12 in front of hundreds of stunned fans inside Doha's Al Sadd Sports Club.

It was a match that had everything that the sport of pool could possibly offer; fantastic, clutch shot making, an unbelievably impossible comeback, edge of your seat drama that was downright unbearable, and a finish that blew the roof off the house.

For Appleton, the win is his first World 9-ball Championship and is the culmination of a dream he has held since turning to pool from English 8-ball in the mid-2000's. With his World 10-ball crown in 2009, his double US Opens in 2010 and 2011, and now the World 9-ball Championship, Appleton can certainly lay claim to be one of the greats of all time.

For Lee, he came within a whisker of nearly pulling off a comeback for the ages, and at the same time, earned for himself the admiration of legions of pool fans around the world who were in awe at the 31 year old's tenacity and

never-say-die spirit.

What's more striking for Lee is that midway through the match he was nothing more than an after-thought to a sure coronation for Appleton. Lee, who had beaten Ralf Souquet in the semis, was absolutely and thoroughly written off by

every single person who was watching in person or following the match online streamed over the Al Kass Sports channel.

That's because after handily taking down Japan's Naoyuki Ohi in the semi-final, Appleton raced out of the starting gates in the race to 13, alternate break final and was streaking towards a total rout on the way to the title.

After splitting the first four racks, Appleton caught the type of gear every single pro player dreams about when they wonder how they would hope to play in a championship final. He had several break and run outs, he punished every mistake Lee made, and as he piled up the racks and his lead grew ever wider, he literally oozed confidence.


Clearly in that rarefied zone that's only reserved for the great champions, Appleton soon

found himself out in front 9-2. Lee got one rack back to make it 9-3, but that didn't deter the Englishman as a break and run and a clear off a scratch by the Chinese pushed the score to 11-3. At this point, the score line and the body language of both players told the whole story; the match was surely over and it was just a formality of going through the last few motions before Appleton would be lifting the trophy. It was such a sure thing that Appleton's fans on Facebook took to congratulating "Darren Appleton, the new World 9-ball Champion."

When Lee grabbed the next rack to make the score 11-4, nobody even thought anything of it. When Appleton failed to convert off a foul by Lee in the next rack, and even scratched to help get Lee to 11-6, it still didn't mean anything to anyone. Indeed Appleton, for all intents and purposes, put the match away in the next rack when he cleared the colors after Lee left a safety open, and moved to within one of the world title.

But then, with Appleton leading 12-6, that moment came, that mysterious turning point where the balls, seemingly impregnated with a mind of their own, had had enough of catering to the Englishman's every whim, and abandoned him like the plague.




alone make it and leave yourself in a position to make the 8. Whether you make a legal shot or not, you are left in the unenviable position of taking your seat and watching your opponent run out.

If you prefer to take a more aggressive and proactive approach, consider taking an intentional foul by hitting the 8-ball in order to block the corner pocket. Instead of returning to the table to run out, your opponent now has a much more difficult layout and some problem balls to contend with.

Rather than watching your opponent run out, you will most likely have at least one more turn at the table.

# Allison Fisher and Gerda Hofstatter Clash in a Classic Battle for the 2012 WPBA U.S. Open Title

The WPBA U.S. Open 9-Ball Championships were held at the River Spirit Casino in Tulsa, OK from June 7th - 10th. As expected, the field was comprised of the some of the top women players in the World including defending champion Allison Fisher, Jeanette Lee, Vivian Villareal, Ewa Laurance and Colorado WPBA players Melissa Little, Laura Smith and Nicole Keeney.

We'll pick up the action in the quarterfinals . . .

In the first matchup of the day, Great Britain native and defending champion, #1 ranked Allison Fisher quickly bested Swedish native Helena Thornfeldt 7-1.

In quarter final #2, Atlanta's Monica Webb, the #2 seed in this event, took on junior national champion Brittany Bryant of Canada with a 7-3 victory.

The third quarterfinal match featured a thrilling hill-hill battle between the "Black Widow" Jeanette Lee and Norway's Line Kjorsvik. A see-saw battle between the two veteran players put the score at 4-4 before Kjorsvik pulled ahead 6-4. But Jeanette won the next rack to pull within a game, then broke and ran the next to tie the match 6-6, and went on to close out the final game for a 7-6 victory!

The last match of the day was between Austrian native (now residing in Charlotte and six months pregnant!) Gerda Hofstatter, a veteran tour champion, and two-time junior national champion Mary Rakin of California, making her first-ever appearance in a televised match. Rakin drew first blood with a two-game lead but Gerda quickly answered with three of her own and the match was soon tied 5-5. An early miss by Mary put Gerda back in the driver's seat; she ran out to lead 6-5, then won 7-5 with a seven-nine combo. In the first semi-final matchup between the #1 and #2 seeds, the. ESPN cameras rolled as Monica Webb and Allison Fisher, two veteran champions, took the stage.

Monica took the first point in the race to seven, but Allison quickly answered with two games of her own. Monica won the next three to lead 4-2. In the seventh game, Allison missed a surprising five ball in the corner that put Webb back at the table to extend her lead 5-2.

Allison picked up the next game to trail 5-3, and



then another to trail 5-4 when Monica ended up short on a nine ball and missed a cross-side bank. She then broke and ran out to tie the match 5-5, and again to get to the hill, 6-5!

With no shot after the break, Fisher was forced to push out. A safety battle ensued but Fisher got first look at a long, sharp cut on the one. She nailed that, and proceeded to execute a tricky rack to take the win 7-5! Webb finished tied for third place.

The second semi-final matchup took place between two long-time WPBA players and champions, Austrian native Gerda "G-Force" Hofstatter and one of the sport's best known players, the "Black Widow" Jeanette Lee!

Gerda struck first, quickly taking a three game lead in the race to seven. The fourth rack looked to be all Jeanette's until a miscue on the seven gave Gerda ball-in-hand and a 4-0 lead.

In game five, Gerda played safe on a five ball; Open title!

Jeanette missed the kick and Gerda again ran out to lead 5-0. In the next rack, Hofstatter played safe on the one, leaving Jeanette a tough kick. Lee nailed the kick but left Gerda another rack to maneuver through to get to the hill 6-0.

Gerda broke and ran to a long three, missing and leaving Jeanette a view. Jeanette made a great runout to get on the board, then broke and ran out to trail 2-6. Breaking in two balls on the next rack, Jeanette looked good to run another, but uncharacteristically rattled a two ball in the corner pocket.


Gerda made the two, came up short on the three and made a great shot but was left tough on the five, and missed. Jeanette ran out to trail 3-6, then won the next game before Gerda finally got a clear shot back at the table to take the match 7-4 and earn a trip to the finals to play Allison Fisher!

To start the finals, Gerda Hofstatter won the opening lag and break, pocketing the six and playing safe. Fisher missed the kick and with ball in hand, Gerda ran the rack to lead 1-0, but lost the safety battle in the next rack to give Allison her first game. Gerda got back to the table in game three, but Gerda missed a tough 8, leaving Allison a bank on the eight and an easy nine to pull ahead 2-1.

In rack four, Gerda made a classic two ball shot, only to be called a foul. She protested the call and officials reviewed on the ESPN cameras and the call was reversed! She then proceeded to make a brilliant run-out to tie the match 2-2.

The match tied again at 3-3, but then Allison took advantage of a foul and a 3-9 combo to lead 4-3, followed by a break and run to take the first two game lead in the match 5-3. In the ninth rack she won an early safety battle and ran out from the two ball to get to the hill 6-3.

In the final rack, Allison had a dry break but Gerda missed a long cut on the 2. Allison was hooked, kicked to safe. Gerda left a shot though and Allison ran out to win her record 6th US Open title!

I've watched you play, and have played against you several times, and something I've always noticed is that you rarely break dry..... Without giving up any of your secrets, what kind of changes/adjustments during a match do you make to your break to find your 'sweet' spot?"

DANNY: Willie Masconi once told me to break the balls as hard as possible because the quicker you strike the stack of balls the faster the cue ball will squat onto the table. So I took it heart and from then on I've always hits the balls as hard as possible.

Mark Chernin from Lecompton, KS asks: Is it legal to jump a ball


playing One-Pocket?

It happened when, after breaking in rack 19, Appleton had a wide open layout to the finish line and the world championship. But with just four easy balls left, he inexplicably snookered himself. Appleton was forced to play safe but a counter safe led to a foul and another rack for Lee.

From there on, everything went Lee's way, while Appleton couldn't buy a piece of fortune. Appleton blew a push out and Lee cleared to make it 12-8. Appleton left a safety open and Lee cleared again. Then Lee broke and ran to make the score 12-10.

Having come back from sure defeat, Lee was suddenly in free-wheeling mode, playing without a care in the world. Appleton, on the other hand, looked like he was bearing the weight of several worlds squarely on his shoulders. And it would only get worse.

Lee moved to within one at 12-11 when Appleton tried to jump but missed and left the shot on, allowing Lee to run out. With the drama building to a massive crescendo, Lee then coolly stepped up in the next game and broke and ran. After 24 racks, the World Championship was to be decided by one single frame.

With the crowd in a state of disbelief, and the tension in the arena at the boiling point, a shell shocked Appleton, who had only moments prior been waltzing his way to the world title, gamely stood up to give it one last go.

He got a ball down and could see the one ball, which he pocketed. But the 2-ball was unavailable and he played a safety. Lee then played a counter safety. Appleton then pulled out his jump stick and proceeded to make history; he jumped the cue ball over the blocking ball and potted the 2-ball at a fairly sharp angle straight into the side pocket.

The crowd erupted as a suddenly rejuvenated Appleton grabbed his cue and then picked off the remaining colors. As the 8-ball fell and left the Englishman with an elementary shot on the championship ball, Appleton let out a shout and pumped his fist. Then as the 9-ball fell Appleton roared like a proud lion. Impulsively he jumped up on the pool table with his arms and cue held high, then pumped his fists and shouted, then jumped down from the table and threw his stick onto the ground in pure joy and relief as the crowd lustily cheered him on.

After taking in the cheers, the hugs and congratulations from well wishers, Appleton tried to figure out what had just happened.

"At 11-3 down I lost my focus," Appleton said. "That's because I had played so good up to that point. I was anxious to get it over with. And I'm thinking, I can't lose, he needs a miracle. At 12-6 I was sure it was over because I had the easiest clearance you could ever have. But I snookered myself because I had too much adrenalin. Then after that, nothing happened for me. Around 12-10 I started feeling the heat."

For Lee he had figured the match was over when he was down 11-3 and he never considered he could come back until a few racks later, when he started to notice Appleton getting concerned.

"At first I didn't think I could catch up," Lee said through an interpreter. "Then at 12-6 I started to play well because it was like I had already lost the match so I was relaxed. When I started to get close to him I could feel that he was nervous and then I started to get excited, thinking I can win."

But while Lee nearly made a miracle comeback, it was Appleton who pulled off the miracle win, at the very last chance, in the biggest match of his life.

"If I'd have lost that match I would have jumped off a bridge," Appleton said. "But I played the best rack of my life that last rack. Incredible. I can't believe what just happened."



# Kelly Fisher Claims the Gold at the 2012 Women's World 9-Ball Championship

Capping an all around solid week of pool with yet another air tight performance, Britain's Kelly Fisher won the 2012 WPA Women's World 9-ball Championship with an emphatic 9-6 victory over Chinese superstar Fu Xiaofang, in front of a packed house inside the Richgate Shopping Center in this northeastern Chinese city.

With the victory Fisher now holds the distinction of being the only woman to ever hold the World 9 ball and World 10-ball Championships all at the same time. But perhaps more importantly, the win cemented Fisher's status as the hottest player in the women's game right now, and is a lasting testament to years of toil, long travel and plenty of near misses to go along with a lot of W's. With the victory she will now claim the mantle of WPA World Number 1.

It was an all-around brilliant Thursday for the 34 year old from Yorkshire, as she took down

two huge names in Chinese pool on their own turf. The opening salvo came with a dramatic match against 2009 World 9-ball Champion Liu Shasha in the semi-finals. Fisher had to slog it out for over two hours and the contest went down to the last ball, with Fisher claiming a heart stopping 9-8 win by a whisker.

The final started well for both players. Fisher won the lag and broke and ran for the early lead.

Fu stepped up and did the same to tie the match at 1-1

Fu then stepped on the gas for the next twenty minutes, performing perfectly, winning two safety battles sandwiched around a break and run, to go up 4-1.

Fu had clearly caught a gear and was well on her way to clearing the next rack for a massive 5-1 lead. But as she stretched far over the table to line up a shot, the referee called a foul, saying she had touched a ball with her shooting hand.

As so happens in pool, one small incident mysteriously sends the momentum, and the roll of the balls, over to the other side. Fisher cleared the table to cut the lead to 4-2. She then caught a break in the subsequent rack when an over-hit cue happened to land on a 6-9 combination, which

Fu then missed a long one ball and Fisher cleared to tie at 4-4. In rack 9, Fisher grabbed her first lead at 5-4 when Fu left a safety open.

she nailed.

After the pair traded break and runs, Fisher started tightening the screws. She won the next rack after she buried Fu in a lockdown safety, forcing Fu to scratch. With Fisher up 7-5, Fu lost another when she inexplicably failed to hit a rail after trying to hide the balls.

Fu cut the score to 8-6 but Fisher went out in style with a break and run to reach the holy grail. But as the last 9 ball fell, Fisher didn't realize that she had won, as she thought match was a race to 11. Only when she looked up and saw Fu shaking her hand and the photographers furiously snapping photos did she realize she was the new World 9-ball Champion.

After receiving the golden trophy and drinking in the accolades from the throng of fans, an ecstatic Fisher said she was not only happy with her accomplishment, but also with the way she did it

"I'm absolutely thrilled," a beaming Fisher said. "I can't explain what I'm feeling. I just can't believe it. I played really solid tonight. I played solid all week. Overall I'm really happy with my performance."

As usual with all the Chinese pool stars, Fu was the model of graciousness in defeat. She admitted, however, that the foul in rack six affected her frame of mind.

"After I fouled, the match seemed to change," she said. "And my emotions changed. I wasn't the same after that."

Fu also confessed that playing in a world championship final in China with millions of fans expecting her to win brought on almost unbearable pressure.

"The finals were stressful," Fu said. "I'm Chinese and everyone in China wants me to win."

Fisher, who pocketed \$40,000 for her win, pointed to Fu's foul in rack six as the point where the match turned. But after a week where she played brilliantly and won two 9-8 thrillers in the knockout stage, the new world champion figured there must be a much bigger picture involved.

"She was playing well until that foul," Fisher said. "That was the turning point. But you know this week somebody has been by my side."
