

2013 WPA World Artistic Pool Championship A Resounding Success!

The 12th WPA World Artistic Pool Championship finished after 4 days of exciting competition from July 18 – 21, 2013 at the luxurious Rio All-Suites Hotel and Casino in Las Vegas, Nevada. This event was held during the 37th BCAPL National Championships under the sponsored venue umbrella of CSI (Cue Sports International). There were 31 Artistic Pool Playing Artists from around the world competing for 9 separate world titles (1 overall + 8 discipline champions).


Thirteen competitive sessions were conducted over the 4-day period with the final session showcasing the top 6 scoring players (after the 1st 6 disciplines). Andy Segal, Nick Nikolaidis, and Sebastian Giumelli were neck and neck on the final few challenges, but Andy displayed great poise and burning focus to capture the "overall" title, posting a very impressive score of 254 points out of 320 points possible for the 40 shots / challenges done. Nick and Sebastian were tied at 245 points each, but Nick finished in 2nd place based on more 1st attempt makes. Congratulations Andy for a great championship victory!!

Artistic Pool focuses on specific cueing challenges skillfully attempted under 8 discipline categories as follows (title winners are listed after each category): 1) Trick / Fancy Shots – Nick Nikolaidis (perfect score), 2) Special Arts

APA Family Mourns the Passing of Co-Founder and Billiard Hall of Famer Larry Hubbart

LAKE SAINT LOUIS, MO (August 23, 2013) The APA network is sad to report the passing of APA Co-Founder and Billiard Hall of Famer Larry Hubbart. Hubbart, passed away on August 22 at his home after a long battle with various health issues. Hubbart leaves behind his wife, Nancy, six children, eight grandchildren and countless family

Originally from Rochester, N.Y., Hubbart was one of the top professional poolplayers of his era during the late 70s and early 80s, winning numerous titles including the 1976 U.S. Open 8-Ball Championship, 1977 World 9-Ball Championship and the 1979 World 8-Ball Championship.

He will best be remembered however for bringing countless amateurs to the sport of pool through the APA Leagues. In the late 70s, Hubbart teamed with partner Terry Bell, to establish the vision for the APA Pool Leagues. That vision lead to an organization that today boasts more than a quartermillion active mem-

achievements.

bers and hosts the world's largest pool tournament.

"We're all extremely saddened by Larry's passing. He was a great man who was dedicated to his family, his business and to the sport of pool. Larry fought a very courageous battle the past few years, and we hope he has finally found some peace. Our prayers go out to Nancy and the entire Hubbart family," said APA President Renee Lyle.

Hubbart's last public appearance came in October 2010, when he and Bell were inducted in into the Billiard Hall of Fame.

It was perhaps the crowning achievement for a life devoted to the sport of pool.



Nearly 270,000 members compete in weekly 8-Ball and 9□Ball League play. The APA is generally recognized as the *Governing Body of Amateur Pool*, having established the official rules, championships, formats and handicap systems for the sport of amateur billiards.

The APA produces three major tournaments each year—the APA National Team Championships, the APA National Singles Championships and the U.S. Amateur Championship—that, together, pay out nearly \$1.5 Million in cash and prizes annually!

An Interview with Pro Player Dave Matlock



At one time, people said he was <u>THE</u> best bar table player in the world; he has won hundreds of tournaments around the USA and was nominated "Player of the Decade" in the 80's. It was a pleasure and honor to interview David and

just to let you know this is the only interview he has given to the press. So thank you David for giving us a glimpse into your personal and professional life.... ©

The Interview:

Viper: Where were you born?

Dave: I was born in Fort Carson, CO – I was a military brat because my dad was in the army.

Viper: What are your biggest accomplishments in the sport of billiards?

Dave: The one tournament that really stands out is when I won the 2006 Derby City Classic Banks event and during the same week had a 5th- 8th place finish in the One-Pocket event. These high finishes gave me enough points to have finished 2nd in the All-Around Division.

Viper: Do you have a nickname?

Dave: Scott Smith, pro tournament director, for years has been calling me the "Gun Fighter".

Viper: What do you do when you're not competing?

Dave: I am still very much involved with the sport and am currently the house pro at Shooters Billiards in Olathe, KS. I give lessons multiple times per week. My rate is \$50 per hour with a minimum of two hours booked. Teaching pool is the one thing I truly enjoy most. ☺

Viper: How would someone contact you for lessons?

Dave: They can call me on my cell and set up an appointment -(913) 269-1077.

Viper: Do you have siblings?

Dave: Melissa, I have a huge family. I am one of 15 kids – There are 4 sisters and 11 brothers. Unfortunately, five of my siblings have passed away. I am the 7th son and the 10th one born.



Viper: Do or did any of them play pool?

Dave: When I was younger, my older brother Jimmy played pool, but as an adult he never stuck with the game.

How did get you started?

Dave: I was born in Colorado and then my family moved to Rolla, MO. At the age of 15, I played high school football and in-between daily practices the boys and I would go to a little place called Stan's Pool Hall to play pool.

Viper: When I was a kid, I was told that you locked yourself in a room with a bar table for 6-months and came out a champion. Is any of that true?

Dave: No.... Sorry to say Melissa, none of that is true. But that's a good story!

Viper: In your opinion, what part of the world produces the best players? and Why?

Dave: There is no question about it - the Philippines. I don't really know how to answer why that's so. I do know that it's a rough life over there and they have to work really hard to get what they want – it's a dog eat dog third world country. Their work ethic is off the chart. You can just automatically see their dedication to pool.

Over the years, I have been so impressed with Filipino player Efren Reyes. He literally changed the game of pool. When he first came

over to the US, he brought a

whole new dimension to us American players – He really taught us what one foul pool was by the way he kicked at balls and maneuvered the cue ball in and out of traffic for suburb position.

Viper: Who was your favorite pro player growing up?

Dave: Buddy Hall was my favorite. At one time, his 9-ball game was so powerful and when he was playing well, he made pool look beautiful to watch. It's a shame and unfortunate that today's generation couldn't see Buddy in his prime.

Viper: Did you ever play in a pool league?

Dave: *No – just tournaments.*

Viper: Are you good at any other sports?

Dave: When I was younger I loved to play base-ball. I played with some of the best semi-pro players from MO and some of them even eventually tried out for the major leagues. I was pretty good myself for a little guy with a big arm. They didn't call me "The cannon" for nothing!

Viper: Describe yourself in three words?

Dave: The Good, the Bad and the Ugly... lol.

Note from Editor: Due to an ongoing health issue, Tom will not be contributing new articles for awhile. For now, we will dip into his vast archives while he's on the mend. Please keep Tom in your thoughts and prayers.

August 2002

Often, when players get together apart from competition they like to trot out their favorite shots. Sometimes we see a standard trick shot or two but are more likely to witness what I like to call "tricky" shots, ones that can come up in a game as problems with no obvious solutions. A Grady Mathews exhibition consists of one eyepopping shot after another, all useful in real play if they turn up. He showed me one a few years ago with such unimaginable cue-ball movement that it made me feel like the game I had been playing up to then was something other than pool. The shot came up for me last year in a tournament final and helped me move from a 6-5 deficit to a 7-6 victory. Thank you Grady.

Someday I will share that shot here but for now I want to present three shots that I learned from local players who possess enough talent and experience to rival the game's well-known stars. So, let's step out from the usual discipline and work to have fun while learning something new. Shot A in the diagram belongs to Jim Blakeman,

one of Denver's best allaround players. It is a shot that I had tried from a book illustration but had never executed successfully before watching Jim shoot it so effortlessly. Set up the cue ball and object ball as shown an unavoidable

scratch in the side pocket if cutting the object ball into the corner. You may place other balls around to make shooting the ball into the corner the only offensive option. the shot itself is not easy you may want to play it a couple of times, suffering the scratch, to become comfortable with cutting that ball down the rail. Once you are pocketing the ball you can shoot it with a technique for beating the side-pocket scratch. Accomplishing that requires jumping the cue ball just high enough to hit the rim of the pocket liner and bounce off of it, back onto the table. It is not a big jump shot by any

means so the key to success lies in elevating the back of your cue no more than twenty-to-twenty-five degrees and resisting any temptation to hit the shot hard. The ideal amount of force will send the object ball along the rail with just enough speed to get it into


MHB the pocket.


And make sure to the hit cue ball

above center to give it the topspin that will make it jump upwards when it hits the pocket rim.

On the same night that Jim demonstrated the first shot, Jake Jacobsen showed us shot B. I had seen and tried this one before with some success but no consistency for the same reason that I had problems with the first shot. I had been shooting too hard and hitting the cue ball too low. Set up the bank shot shown with the object ball frozen to the rail. The challenge is to bank the object ball cross corner and avoid the double kiss, an impossible task with a conventional hit. However, a jump shot makes the bank possible and a little practice will provide enough consistency to attempt it in a game under favorable conditions.

Viper: If you had to live your life over again, what would one thing you change about yourself and/or your pool career?

Dave: One thing I would change is that I wouldn't have played so much on the bar table. I wish I had played more on big (9 ft.) table. I never really gave myself an opportunity to try and get the recognition of becoming the #1 player in the world. I never played a full year out on tour.

But don't get me wrong, I still had a lot of enjoyment playing on the bar table. If a younger player was making a choice to which table to start off on, I would suggest playing on the 9 ft. table. Besides, these days everyone plays well on the bar

Viper: How do you prepare for events?

Dave: I always practiced by myself and before big events I would put in at least 6-7 hours a day for 3-4 days in a row.

Viper: What was the best advice you were ever given?

Dave: When I was 15-years-old, I was given the knowledge of the "5-System". A long time friend of mine in the pool hall taught me this technique on a 3-cushion billiards table. Later, The 3-Rail System really woke my game up and taught me how to kick, bank and play good position. I encourage all of the readers to learn about it and apply it to their game.

Viper: What is one thing that you enjoy most while playing pool?

Dave: I have always enjoyed helping other players with their games. It's an awesome feeling when one of your students comes up to you and says that they won their first tournament or banked in a shot or kicked a ball in just from learning from you! I love it!

Viper: If you could say one thing to a young up-coming player what would it be?

Dave: Stay in school and focus on your studies. It's so important to follow your education and it doesn't take up that much time to finish high school and attend college. You can always play pool down the road later on in life.

Viper: What's your Favorite game?

Dave: 3-Cushion Billiards, Snooker and bar pool. Really ALL the games pool has to offer, I truly love them all!!!

Viper: Did anyone give you pool lessons?

Dave: Some people would share information but mostly I was selftaught and playing 35-40 hours per week always helps too.

Viper: Did you ever play in any 3-Cushion Billiards tournaments?

Dave: I only played in two 3cushion events in my whole pool career and both were in 1975. I finished 8th in the first event and 2nd place the other one.

Okay Dave, here are some questions from some of my Facebook friends...

Bill Akers from Mediapolis, Iowa asks: Throughout the years, who was his biggest rival and who was his toughest competition on the bar box?

Dave: I really didn't have any rivals, but some of my goals were to beat players like Keith McCready, David Howard (aka "Little David") and of course, Buddy Hall. Eventually, I beat them all on the bar table.

Josh Soneathit Souvannakasy from Anchorage, Alaska asks: If he were a hustler, what pool name he would like to be?

Dave: "The Outlaw" Josey Wales.

Improve your Shot from San Antonio, Texas asks: How does he over come the jitters?

Dave: The best way to get rid of the jitters is by constantly staying in action and also playing the best players. But I want you to know that EVERYONE gets nervous and it how long it takes you to get into your rhythm is the key.

If someone has told you to never get nervous, I would have to say they are lying or they are not trying to play their best. Even the top pros get a little nervous. All it means is you're ready to go. You're ready to rumble on the table. 3


Dave Berns Shows His Skill and Patience

Sportsmanship According to Wikipedia

A Gentle Reminder to Practice It at All Times

Sportsmanship is an aspiration or ethos that a sport or activity will be enjoyed *for its own sake*, with proper consideration for fairness, ethics, respect, and a sense of fellowship with one's competitors. A sore loser refers to one who does not take defeat well, whereas a good sport means being a "good winner" as well as being a "good loser".

Sportsmanship can be conceptualized as an enduring and relatively stable characteristic or disposition such that individuals differ in the way they are generally expected to behave in sport situations. In general, sportsmanship refers to virtues such as fairness, self-control, courage, and persistence, and has been associated with interpersonal concepts of treating others and being treated fairly, maintaining self-control if dealing with others, and respect for both authority and opponents. Sportsmanship is also looked at as being the way one

reacts to a sport/game.

A competitor who exhibits poor sportsmanship after losing a game or contest is often called a "sore loser" (those who show poor sportsmanship after winning are typically called "bad winners"). Sore loser behavior includes blaming others for the loss, not accepting responsibility for personal actions that contributed to the defeat, reacting to the loss in an immature or improper fashion, making excuses for the defeat, and citing unfavorable conditions or other petty issues as reasons for the defeat.

A bad winner acts in a shallow fashion after his or her victory, such as by gloating about his or her win, rubbing the win in the face(s) of the opponent(s), and lowering the opponent's self-esteem by constantly reminding the opponent(s) of "poor" performance in comparison (even if the opponent(s) competed well).



The proper techniques and speed are very similar to those of shot A: moderate elevation, an above-center hit on the cue ball, light-tomedium speed. When struck properly the cue ball will jump almost straight up while the object ball passes underneath toward its destination. This shot will turn up in some trick-shot exhibitions where the performer will call up someone to try it. After several unsuccessful attempts by the unwitting spectator, the star will then substitute a golf ball for the cue ball and make the bank shot easily. The much-lighter golf ball bounces away quickly enough to escape the kiss as the object ball makes its way slowly cross table. Try it.

Shot C, my favorite of the three, comes from Chris Onesky, who showed it to me a couple of years ago. I have never seen anyone else shoot it or diagram it before or since. The diagram illustrates it as an eight-ball shot but it can just as easily be set up for nine ball; the requirement is hitting and pocket-

ing the ball hanging in the far corner. Of the three, this shot may be the most challenging because of its speed sensitivity, but is otherwise not exceedingly difficult. If struck too hard the cue ball will jump off of the table while too soft of a hit will cause it to rebound away from, instead of along, the side rail; softer still and the cue ball will not get over the obstructing balls. The hit requires slightly less elevation than the first two shots and some inside english, right in the diagrammed setup. Aim to hit the rail as close to the obstructing balls as comfortable with a sharp, but not hard, jump stroke. The english will help keep the cue ball close to the side

There you have three entertaining and, maybe someday, useful variations on the jump shot. Remember always to employ safe, jump-shot precautions. Move any nearby glass; find a corner where you can practice without shooting the cue ball toward other players and then chasing it around the room; and watch out for passersby. If you should happen to injure someone while practicing any of these shots, please instruct that person to take the medical bill to Shakespeare's and present it to me-Howard Ash-



Justin Wray from Salem, Arkansas asks: Which particular opponent's high gear actually made him nervous?

Dave: I would have to say Wade Crain (aka "Boom-Boom") from NC. He could put some racks together on you and he had a very powerful break. I think if I am not mistaken, he was one of the only players from the men's Camel Pro Tour that ever had a perfect Accu-Stats score of 1000, and it was in the finals against Buddy Hall.

Justin also asks: Are there any "current" players that remind him of his younger self?

Dave: There are so many great players I have seen over the past 35-40 years of my playing, but one player sticks out a little more than the others and that's Jessie Bowman. I think he's got a great allaround game and he has become quite the bar table specialist. I like his game a lot!

Richard Penny from Starke, Florida asks: What's it like knowing that whichever bar or tavern you walk into, with a bar box table, you are the winner?

Dave: It's a good feeling - in the 70's and 80's I played most of the great players!

Dawayne Pearson from Plainfield, Indiana asks: I'm curious to know his highest billiard run is playing 3-Cushion Billiards?

Dave: Dawayne, I was playing in a tournament in IL and between matches, I played 3-Cushion Billiards with a friend of mine and ran 15 Billiards in a row.

Mark Chernin from Lecompton, Kansas asks: Is he 60 years old

Dave: Mark, not yet... I am 59 years old.

David Cockayne from Moines asks: What is his record of racks run in a row playing 9-ball?

Dave: David, I once ran 13 racks of 9-ball on an opponent.

Todd Ward from Kansas City, Kansas asks: How's he deal with age and eyesight issues? I'm 47 and every day it seems different....

Dave: Todd, it seems like you need to see the eye doctor. I have not been able to see up close-up since my early 40's. When I was younger I used to hold my cue on the wrap area of my cue, but now that I am older and can't really see close up anymore, I tend to hold my cue further on the back of the cue, like around the butt end. Try it; it might help to get that extra length to see a little bit better. It works for me anyways.
