



This year's qualifying tournament for the **US Amateur Championship**



You Must Master The Stop & Stun Shot

Reprinted from January 1999

Very often, maybe incessantly, I tell students that in order to become great players they must master the stop shot. More than any technique in pool the stop shot removes randomness and turns probability into certainty. On a straight-in shot where the shooter can stop the cue ball dead he knows precisely where the cue ball will come to rest. On a cut shot the player knows when he executes a stop shot that the cue ball will follow the track off of the object ball perpendicular to the ball's path to the pocket. In both cases the stop shot removes guesswork from the position play and offers the player confidence rather than hope.

Once mastered the stop shot also serves as a reliable reference point or benchmark. This month we shall examine that aspect of the stop shot while learning a couple of shots in the process. Set up the shot in the diagram and place the cue ball at position X. From there shoot some stop shots hitting the cue ball just below center with medium-firm speed and a

good punch stroke. After you are stopping the cue ball consistently you can begin to adjust your hit on the cue ball for some stun shots.

While preparing to shoot put your tip on the cue ball where you


would hit it for a stop shot and then move it up a hair, maybe a sixteenth of an inch, to hit a stun shot with some follow. Shoot the shot with the same speed and punch stroke until the cue ball is moving forward just a few inches after hitting the object ball. When you are hitting stun-

follow shots consistently vou can try the same thing for stun draw by adjusting your tip down slightly and doing everything else the same way. The stun-draw shot should,

despite the firm stroke, move the cue ball back just a few inches off of the object ball.


These two stun shots are essential to a complete pool game and very useful in many situations where normal follow and draw shots are too difficult to control for such minor cueball movement. Set up a long shot and try the same two shots with follow and draw strokes and the soft speeds needed to move the cue ball so slightly. Usually the shot is extremely difficult and sometimes impossible to control when played so softly. Imagine playing the shot this softly to control the position on a table that may not be level.

Question:

"I really don't enjoy drills and much prefer playing with friends to improve my game. Do you think playing with friends and in leagues is as productive as practicing drills to sharpen my skills?"

Answer:

I really don't like drills either - but are they good for my pool game? YES, YES, AND YES!!!!

For advice I recommend trying to incorporate all different types of games, drills, total offense, and practice with friends to improve your game. But be aware that if you do practice with friends make sure you try your BEST!!! If you catch yourself just hitting balls without meaning then it's really not good for your pool game.

When I practice with friends some of them mention, "Wow, give me a chance, it looks like your trying to beat me"? Well guess what? I am trying to beat you!! When I get to the table I feel disciplined enough to try hard every time!! At this point in my career I cannot afford to just have fun and hit meaningless balls. I take pool very seriously.... And I think everyone should!! If my friends want to have fun with me then I recommend going to the movies or shopping...now that's fun!

I don't like drills, one-pocket, billiards, 8-ball -- but the reason I don't like them is because I am not good at them. But I am honest and I look forward to playing them because one day I will be good at them all. I would like to be known as a great ALL AROUND pool player, not just a good 9-ball player.

So pick up your cue today and try something different - you never know you might be good at it and if not then challenge yourself..... ©

Pro Player Travel Fund Assists Players at Women's World 9-Ball Championship



Previously, the Pro Player Travel Fund provided assistance to the US Team that competed in the World Team Championship.

Xiao-Fang Fu Wins over Allison Fisher for World 9-Ball Championship

Shanghai, China A new name in the
billiards world will
stand out as China's
Xiao-Fang Fu has been
crowned the 2010
Women's World
9-Ball Champion. Fu
toppled a star studded
field and overcame legendary Allison Fisher
in the finals to become
the second consecutive
Chinese woman to win
the Championship.

Fu made it through the beginning stage of the event making the top half cut to reach the round of 32 players. She made relatively short work of Hui Shan Lai 9-3, Ho Yun Tan 9-2, and a tough quarter finals match with former Amway Cup winner Chieh-Yu Chouh of Taiwan 9-7. In the semi-finals, she faced her friend and defending World 9-Ball Champ Sha Sha Liu of China, whom she defeated 9-6 to reach the finals.

Fu has been a rising star in China, but has not

been able to translate that success in international competition. This event marks a turning point in the road for her life. On the other side of the bracket another player facing her fork in the road was Allison Fisher. Fisher almost didn't make it to the World Championship when news of her brother's death reached her hours before her flight.

Her father had passed a few years earlier, and both had been major influences on her life and career.

Allison did decide to go but decided to keep the news of the tragedy private. A player could easily crumble under those circumstances but Fisher lived up to her name of "Duchess of Doom" as she

steam rolled her first four opponents with a combined score of 32 games to 8 before reaching the quarter-finals. Fisher looked liked a woman on a mission and became the event favorite early on as she crushed WPBA star Gerda Hofstatter 7-3, and then defeated Germany's Ina Jentschura 7-2. In the round of 32, "Doom" demolished China's Xiao-Chun Zheng 9-2, and then played a near flawless match against USA's Angel Paglia 9-1 with a total of 8 break and run-outs during the match.

Asia's dominance in the sport has been well cemented in recent years, and in the Sweet 16, only 6 westerners made it to that round including Paglia USA, Kelly Fisher ENG, Brittany Bryant CAN, Monica Webb USA, Ine Helvik GER, and Allison Fisher ENG. Surprise early exits by pretournament favorites were made by Jasmin Ouschan, Karen Corr, Yu Ram Cha, Xiaoting Pan and Rubilen Amit who did not make the top 32 cut.

In the Elite Final Eight, Allison Fisher was the only westerner left amongst the other 7 Asian queens of pool. But the Duchess proved once more why she is considered to be the greatest woman's player to ever hold a cue as she toppled 2x World Champion and 2x US Open Champion Ga Young Kim of Korea 9-7. Then in the semifinals, Fisher trailed the entire match to Taiwan's Shu han Chang, but made a thrilling comeback from behind to win 9-8 to reach the finals. When she pocketed the final 9-Ball, with the cueball drifting near towards the corner pocket before stopping just a few inches away, Allison laid her cue on the table and placed both hands together and looked up at the sky in acknowledgement.

"The past couple days as I've progressed further in the event, it has been very emotional for me," explained Fisher.

Colorado Regional Qualifies Five Players for the U.S. Amateur Championship

In a Regional tournament held at Match Up's on September 18th and 19th 5 players out of a field of 63 qualified to compete in the Men's and Women's Divisions of the 2010 U.S. Amateur Championship - the nation's most prestigious amateur billiards tournament. Nelson Montierth of Longmont, Cris Arellano of Greeley, Ken Davismore of Colorado Springs, and Carl Yusuf Khan traveling all the way from Brooklyn NY will join the 128-player field of the nation's best amateur men's players, competing for the title of U.S. Amateur Champion.

Samm Diep of Aurora CO qualified to compete in the Women's Division. Sammy will join the 16-player field of the nation's best amateur women's players, competing for the title of U.S. Amateur Champion.

The 16th Annual event, produced and conducted by the American Poolplayers Association (APA), will take place Nov. 5-7 at Stroker's in Tampa, Fla. The U.S. Amateur Championship is the highest level of amateur billiards competition in North America. In September, hundreds of the top amateur players attempted to qualify for the tournament, but only those who earned top spots during one of the Preliminary Rounds held at regional sites across North America ad-

vance to the championship rounds. This double elimination event offers these top amateur players the opportunity to showcase their skills through a combination of 8-Ball and 9-Ball matches in a race-to-7 format. The U.S. Amateur Championship is the only APA event that does not use *The Equalizer*® handicap system.

In addition to achieving the highest honors in amateur pool, the champion in each division earns a magnificent marble and bronze trophy, event jacket, commemorative champagne and paid travel, lodging and entry into a 2011 pro billiard event. The champion also receives an automatic bid to return and defend their title the following year.

The APA, based in Lake Saint Louis, Mo., sanctions the world's largest amateur pool league, known as the APA Pool League throughout the United States and as the Canadian Pool League in Canada. More than 260,000 members compete in weekly 8-Ball and 9-Ball league play. The APA is generally recognized as the Governing Body of Amateur Pool, having established the official rules, championships, formats and handicap systems for the sport of amateur billiards.

The APA produces three major tournaments each year-the APA National Team Championships, the APA National Singles Championships and the U.S. Amateur Championship-that, together, pay out nearly \$1.5 Million in cash and prizes annually.

The APA and its National Championships are sponsored by Pool Dawg, Aramith Billiard Balls and Action Cues.



Thousands Flock to the 30th Annual APA National Championships

The American Poolplayers Association's (APA) 30th Annual National Team Championships saw a record number of teams compete in the newly expanded 10-day extravaganza. Nearly 2,000 8-Ball, 9-Ball, Doubles and Masters teams made the trek to Sin City to compete, Aug. 19 – 28, for more than \$1 Million in prize money. 8-Ball Open division

8-Ball Open Division



In the 8-Ball Open Division, "Chumba's All Stars" of Topeka, Kan., defeated the "Bad Elements" of Black

Mountain, N.C., 3-1 in the finals to take home \$25,000 in cash and the championship title.

8-Ball Ladies Division



In the finals of the Ladies 8-Ball Division, it was "Don't Need a Man" of Clover, S.C., defeating "Fight Like a Girl" of Hixson, Tenn., 3-2 to win \$10,000 in 1st Place prize money. As Runners-Up, Fight Like a Girl received \$5,000 in cash.

Don't Need a Man advanced to the finals with a victory over defending champions Let It Ride of Bakersfield, Calif., in the semifinals. Fight Like a Girl defeated All Or Nothin of West Monroe, La., in the semifinals to advance.

All teams in the 8-Ball Championships squared-off in a modified single-elimination format that ensured each team played at least twice before elimination. All 8-Ball Open Division teams automatically received \$350 in national qualifier money, and the top 8 teams won at least \$5,000. In the 8-Ball Ladies Division, all teams automatically earned \$350 national qualifier money, with the top 8 teams winning at least \$1,000. The Open Division began play on Aug. 22 and concluded on Aug. 28. The Ladies Division of the tournament started on Aug. 19 and concluded on Aug. 22.

9-Ball Open Division



In Open 9-Ball National Championship action, it was "The Fort" of Baltimore, Md., beating the "Ryders" of Meriden, Conn., 52-48 in the finals. The Fort took home \$15,000 of the more than \$200,000 guaranteed purse. As Runner-Up, the Ryders received \$7,000 in cash.

The Open 9-Ball National Championship was held Aug. 19-23, with each team competing in a modified single-elimination format that ensured each team played at least twice before elimination. All national qualifiers received a minimum of \$350, with the top 6 teams winning at least \$2,000.

After winning their divisions in weekly APA 8-Ball and 9-Ball League play and then placing in Local Team Championships throughout the United States and Canada, 723 Open 8-Ball, 399 Open 9-Ball, and 57 Ladies 8-Ball teams, all consisting of five to eight players, qualified to compete in the 2010 National Team Championships.

In addition, the APA conducted nearly round-the-clock MiniMania tournaments, which took place daily and were open to all APA members. The MiniMania tournaments offered multiple formats with 100% prize money payback that awarded nearly \$200,000.

Players challenged their opponents with shots of their choice, with each player forced to make the shot to score a point. In the event of a tied score, the tiebreaker was an 8rail bank shot onto the face of a \$100 bill. The player who came closest to the center of the bill won the match.

The standing-room-only crowd gave Andy Segal and Jamey Gray a spirited ovation at the conclusion of the final match. Now move the cue ball to position Y and shoot some stop shots. Shoot the shot until you are tracking the cue ball consistently along the solid line with the same medium-firm speed. You can place a ball at position A on the solid line and shoot more stop shots until the cue ball is hitting that ball consistently. While keeping a ball at position A shoot some stun-follow shots to track the cue ball between the obstructing ball and the side pocket. Using this technique you should find it rather easy to track the cue ball consistently. Shoot some shots now with stun draw to track the cue ball between

the obstruction and the center of the table. Using the stop shot as a reference gives you precise control over the cue ball when adjusting its track for position play. When you need a track that lies close to the perpendicular line this technique is far more powerful than merely trying to create the track you need from thin air.

From this reference point you can begin to adjust the cue ball's track in both directions. Making sure to use a punch stroke for each shot you can vary the speed and the spot on the cue ball you choose to hit a range of cue ball tracks. First work with the top half of the cue ball and then the bottom half. Because you are using a punch stroke for every shot you will not be working with the full range of tracks available for this shot. Instead you will discover your punch or stop-stroke range of

cue ball tracks. This will give you feel to control the cue ball's path very precisely as you begin to compare the track that you want to the stop-shot track and adjust from there. As you approach mastery with the stop shot you will begin to associate the punch stroke with reliability and consistency while you find yourself controlling the cue ball with precision and confidence.

Even More Practice to Make Perfect

I've always been told that it takes 21 days to form a habit. If there's something you want to learn or a behavior you'd like to develop, give it 21 solid days and it should become second nature by then.

New information tells us to throw that number out the window. Recent studies by the Medical Research Council indicate the new magic number is 66. Their research has shown that it actually takes us more than three times as long to learn to do something automatically.

According to Professor Jane Wardle, of University College London, "What we found was that it takes 66 days on average for people in our study to acquire a habit." Though the studies varied between individuals, they were able to determine that if you do something every day for 66 days, in the same situation, it will become automatic. Also, "performing an action for the first time requires planning, even if plans are formed only moments before the action is performed, and attention. As behaviors are repeated in consistent settings they then begin to proceed more efficiently and with less thought as control of the

behavior transfers to cues in the environment that activate an automatic response - a habit." What does this mean for pool? Well, depending on what your personal goals are, you may want to consider this information the next time you decide to take the day off from practice.

If you're a beginner, learning a new shot, or changing your mechanics and you do not have 66 straight days to spare in the pool room, it will now take even longer to learn this game. If you're only committing 2-3 days a week to your training, it could take in excess of six months

before changes become automatic to you. And who has that kind of time and patience?

If regular practice wasn't important enough before, we are now reminded of just how detrimental the lack of it can be to our progress. An hour a day keeps the misses away. Even if you only have an hour or less, put in the time and continue to develop that muscle memory.

China Wins the World Cup of Pool

China, represented by Jianbo Fu and He Wen Li, won their second PartyPoker.net World Cup of Pool crown as they dismantled the Philippines by a 10-5 scoreline and silenced a huge home crowd at the Robinsons Place Mall in Manila.

It was the second time that the deadly Chinese duo have now lifted this prestigious crown – they beat Finland in a hill-hill thriller in Rotterdam in 2007 – and they never let up from the opening rack as the home team felt the pressure and never really got going.

Over the week of the tournament, the sheer quality of their play throughout shone through and in Jianbo Fu they have one of the most exciting players in the world. Hewen Li though is as reliable as any player and to win the World Cup twice in four years cements their world class credentials.

"We are very happy with the victory but we just got the luck we needed from the Philippines team," said a reflective Jianbo Fu.

"They made a few mistakes and we took advantage of that. The Philippines team literally gave us the match because they made a lot more mistakes than we did. It was very pressured though, because it was a big pro-Filipino crowd.

"It was like the home court advantage so to win here, we've got to be very, very happy winning the tournament," he added.

For the Philippines side of Dennis Orcollo and Roberto Gomez, it was an anticlimax after their heroic 9-8 defeat of Taiwan in the semis and maybe they were mentally drained by their efforts.

Either way, China took the opening rack to settle their nerves but the Philippines levelled it when their opponents made a mess of the 8 and 9 balls. Every Filipino pot and Chinese miss was greeted with deafening cheers.

It's hard to under-estimate the pressure the players were under and it showed in a shocking third rack as the four struggled to pot a ball between them as the crowd started to get agitated.

Every single player missed shots they would normally have made. Gomez's mistake, when he missed the 9-ball into the side pocket, was the most crucial though and Jianbo Fu downed the 9-ball for a 2-1 lead.

The next rack isn't much better and it went to China to increase their lead and they took the next to go to 4-1 which silenced the huge home crowd.

Orcollo made a huge error in the next when his attempt to snooker the Chinese fell woefully short. Jianbo Fu, normally the most reliable of potters, missed an easy 9 ball but Gomez could only play a less than watertight safety and Hewen Li played a magnificent cut shot to give his side a 5-1 lead.

The Philippines desperately needed a break to stop the runaway train and they got it when Li,

scratched pushing out. They tried for the three foul rule but Fu went off three rails for the great escape. Gomez left a poor snooker which Li potted with a kick shot and it was soon 6-1.

It soon became 7-1 as the dynamic Chinese pair ran out from the break. The Philippines finally got a shot at the 1 ball in the ninth as Li hashed up a 1/4 combo. Orcollo though, missed a tough long cut on the 5 ball and China took another rack. China reached the hill as a weak shot from Orcollo left an open table.

Philippines finally won another rack to reduce arrears to 9-2 and they then broke and ran the next two to get the crowd going. It was all too much of a mountain and although they got to five racks, it was the mighty Jianbo Fu who rolled home the final 9 ball of the tournament for Chinese glory.

As well as the title, magnificent trophy and gold medals, the duo also took the US \$60,000 top prize.

"It was a great performance from us and playing with Fu gives us so much confidence," said Hewen Li.

"To win the World Cup again is an incredible experience and fantastic for Chinese pool and we can't wait to come back next year and try to defend our title," he added.

Did you know . . .

Pool tables originally had flat vertical walls for rails and their only function was to keep the balls from falling off. They resembled riverbanks and even used to be called "banks". Players discovered that balls could bounce off the rails and began deliberately aiming at them. Thus a "bank shot" is one in which a ball is made to rebound from a cushion as part of the shot.




Denver's Own "Cherry Bomb" Strikes Again at the AWBT

After 64 world class players had been reduced down to only two 5 days later. In the finals, Fu jumped out to a gigantic 5-0 lead in the race to 9. Finally Fisher got an opening to run out and finally got a point on the board. But the deficit looked near insurmountable, and it seemed that the personal emotions, fatigue, and overwhelming support for the home country favorite in young Fu would be too much for Fisher, let alone any other player, to withstand. But

the Duchess of Doom showed a mettle that could only come from a champion's champion, and Fisher shot back a dagger into Fu's confidence with 5 straight wins of her own. Fu regrouped back with taking the lead 6-5, but it was only temporary as Fisher tied it at 6-6. Fisher has a chance to run out, but made an error that gave Fu the game at 7-6. But Fisher counter struck in the next game to make it 7-7.

Fisher smashed the rack and was left with an open table which she masterfully maneuvered through but left herself a slight reach on the 9-Ball. She opted for her bridge, which she is known to be a master with, and fired the 9-Ball in. But it failed to go!. Fortunately she left Fu a very tough cut shot down the rail with the

cueball near frozen. Fu made an excellent attempt at the 9-Ball and got rewarded to take the lead 8-7. The next game Fu failed to pocket a ball and left Fisher a mediocre safe. Fisher made the 1ball but hooked herself on the 2-ball, kicked it but left Fu a wide open table and the match looked over. Fu ran out routinely, but the pressure of close finals match gripped her arm as she shot the 8-ball into the point of the rail and missed. Fisher was hooked by the 9-ball and had to masse to hit the 8ball and possibly make it. She made it! But the cueball rolled up table and left herself a very low percentage 9-Ball. She made a fair attempt but it wasn't enough and left Fu

a long bank shot on the 9-Ball. Fu fired at it and missed it terribly by two diamonds and almost fluked it in the side pocket. She again left Fisher a tough but makeable cut shot or bank on the 9-ball. Allison tried to slice the ball down the rail but missed it and ended up further penalized with a scratch. So with ball in hand, a very relieved Fu pocketed the 9-Ball for the win!

"Of course I would have liked to have won the event, but I am very pleased with my performance and result. To be honest over the past few years, I've struggled with my game, but I have re-dedicated

myself to the sport and love playing again. I trained very hard for this event, and feel that my confidence is back, so this great finish was confirmation that I'm on track. I'm really looking forward to the upcoming events because I feel that I'm hungry again and my best games are still yet to come", said Fisher.

For Xiao-Fang Fu, it is a coming of age for the young Chinese woman's player pursuing a career in pool. For Allison Fisher, the event represented a resurgence of greatness and strength in overcoming personal tragedy and demons.


