

## An Interview with Pro Player Mark Haddad



This month I am introducing you Mr. Mark Haddad originally from Sacramento, CA who now resides in Denver, Colorado.

#### The Interview:

Viper: Where were you born? Mark: I was born Oakland, CA in 1965.

Viper: What are your biggest accomplishments in the sport of billiards?

Mark: In my younger years, when I was around 22 years old, I won the San Francisco Open beating Cole Dickson in the finals. I also won the Reno Open twice, once on the bar tables beating Stan Tourangeau in the finals and once on the 9 ft. tables. Another of my favorite wins was the "Santa Rosa Open" with an extremely tough field, beating Morra Paez in the finals. In 2012, I won the "Four Bears" 8-ball tournament in New Town, ND beating the young gun Jesse Engel from Minnesota in the finals.

Viper: Do you have a nickname yet?

Mark: These days they call me "The Deacon" because of my faith in the Lord. In the old days, they called me "Snake" (but I don't like that name) - a guy named Richard Cook better known as "Buck Tooth" gave me that name because I always somehow got the money, he says. Dave Vargas, from San Leandro, CA used to call me "Sweet Pea" because he said I had a sweet stroke.

Viper: What are your short-term goals?

Mark: I got into two car accidents in the past three years and want to get my back/neck fixed. It affects my stroke and my body gets tired in long tournaments.

Viper: What your next upcoming event?

Mark: I am participating in the upcoming \$10,000 added First Annual Open 8-Ball at the Spirit Lake Casino up in ND.

Viper: What do you do when you're not competing?

Mark: I am part owner of two online retail stores; one sells billiard supplies named www.qzetta.com and the other is an Ebay store where I sell vintage collectibles. They keep me pretty busy in the daytime and at night I still love to play pool.

Viper: Do you have siblings?

Mark: Yes, I had three siblings, two brothers and a sister. My oldest brother was murdered in 1995 and the man who was convicted was sentenced to life in prison.

Viper: Who got you started in playing pool?

Mark: When I was 10 years old, I went to the local Boys and Girls club in Oakland, CA where they had a few pool tables. The membership was like \$2 per year and after school I would run as fast as I could just to meet up with my little friends to play the games! I even practiced my stroke in school. I would draw a table on a piece of paper and use the pencil eraser as a cue stick and pennies as the pool balls and I would shoot them into the drawn pockets. It's pretty hard to do but I was entertained for hours until I could get back to the real table.

Viper: What did your parents think of your pool career?

Mark: My dad was very proud of me and would sometimes come to watch me play in tournaments. My brothers would brag about me to their friends and sometimes even get me into different games for cash.

Viper: In your opinion, what parts of the world produce the best players?

Mark: The best pool players in the world live in the Philippines. I was there in 2009 for a month trying to qualify for the World Championships. The local poolrooms had house pros that would challenge any American player for money. They have players there that play so well, but don't have an opportunity to come over here to the US. While watching the World Championships, I also was very impressed with the Taiwanese players. They play extremely well for their

young ages.

Viper: Who is/was your favorite player growing up?

Mark: "Kim Davenport" a professional from CA because of his sweet stroke and Hall "Buddy of Famer Hall" for his position play, hesitation stroke and follow through delivery.

Viper: Do you currently have any sponsors?

Mark: 1 am a player rep and sponsored by Joshua Treadway Custom Cues from Saint Louis, MO.

Viper: Did you ever

play in a pool league?

Mark: Twice as an adult; one time here in Colorado and once in Sacramento, CA

Viper: Are you good at any other sports?

Mark: When I was a kid, I played little league baseball and throughout my life I have been really active playing a variety of sports.

Viper: Describe yourself in three words? Mark: Faithful, devoted and determined.

Viper: If you had to live your life over again, what's one thing you would change about yourself and/or your pool career?

Mark: I would have not changed anything! I traveled to new places and did what I loved to do and that's play pool!!

Viper: How do you prepare for events?

Mark: I practice five hours per day by myself working on all aspects of the game like banks, cuts, the break, rotation and the ghost 1-pocket.

Viper: What was the best advice you were ever given?

Mark: I grew up in a pool hall named Chino's in Oakland where I met a gentleman nick named "Lots of Pappa" real name Henry McCloud from Montgomery, AL that really helped teach me the game of "I-Pocket". His best advice that has stuck with me over the years is to be "Patient". He also taught me a secret banking system that I continue to use to this day.

Viper: What is one thing that you enjoy most while playing pool?

Mark: The excitement of winning and the heat of competition.

Viper: If you could say one thing to a young, upcoming player what would it be?

Mark: Don't be a fool and stay in school!! After school practice as much as possible and pick one person from your town to become a mentor to help encourage you to stay in school and to be the best as you can at this great game of pocket billiards!

Viper: What's your favorite game?

Mark: Any rotation game, 8-Ball and of course 1-Pocket.

## Adventures at the 2013 BCAPL Championships, part 1

Day Zero

This was the first year the BCAPL National Championships, arguably one of the biggest pool tournaments in the world, was to be held at the Rio All-Suite Las Vegas Hotel and Casino. After all those years at the lovably shabby Riviera Hotel and Casino, the Rio was to be a major upgrade.

After a long bus ride through the desert and huffing and puffing through the city streets, I arrived at the fabulous Rio. The checkout line was thankfully short and I dragged my bags up to my room. Since it was still early in the event (the first amateur 8-ball events did not start until the next day), there were no hordes

nor herds of people. This suited me and my claustrophobic nature juulust fine. As did the general roominess of the convention center.

I liked what I saw so far. The tournament this year was truly going to be A Swanktastic Affair. Amateur pool was going to be A Thing, now that we'd moved away from the low hallways and soul-crushingly ugly cabbage-rose carpets of the Riviera.

The table set up for the amateur events was pretty much the same it had been at the Riviera, but there were now WIDE aisles between the sections and I already knew this would be a fall-down-on-your-knees-and-and-cry-for-joy for many of us.

In case you don't remember, at the Riviera, the aisles between sections were often narrow enough so that there would be a traffic glut if

ANYONE stopped to watch a match. Seriously. It was like the world's biggest parking lot — for sweaters and supporters.

No more darting dangerously under peoples' grody armpits for me when I had to hustle to a match. Now, I could stick to my side of the lane and politely tip my hat as I passed. We were all going to be Mary Poppins proper and nice now because THERE WAS ROOM. And chairs. Oh, the chairs. 

Those brutal pockets stopped another bank from falling in the next match, leaving Cecilia with a very well played 3rd place finish! I don't think anybody told Ranee Breckel that the tables were bigger and tighter than the bar tables she usually plays on. Fearless play and timely shotmaking were why Ranee finished second in this strong field.

be signed by the duo for the kids at the Olathe facility. "I love that Melissa is giving back to the next generation and I will support her in anyway that I can," says Tull.




the "Nation's Most Prestigious Amateur Pool Tournament" produced and conducted by the American Poolplayers Association (APA).



Sometimes when we talk about the way things should be we express our desires in the form of wishes and the possibility of undoing things done. "I wish I had a nickel for every time..." or, the common lament, "I'd like to have all the money I've spent on cigarettes, alcohol, clothes I never wore, ammo I wasted on road signs, or (insert your own favorite). Well, I wish that I could have back a tenth of the one-rail kick shots I've missed and the money that those blunders cost me.

What makes one-rail kicks difficult is that all of the systems for executing them are based on hitting the cue ball dead center, not always an easy thing to do, especially under a little pressure. But I believe that I have discovered the perfect practice shot to sharpen our accuracy and maybe mitigate some regret.

Let's begin with shot A, an old, proven shot to zero in on center ball and deliver a straight stroke. Place the cue ball six to eight inches behind the foot spot and shoot it down to the center diamond on the head rail to rebound straight back through the center of the table and roll over the foot spot again. I make sure to place the cue ball behind the foot spot instead of on it when practicing this shot so I can see the line that connects the spot to the diamond on the far rail. And to ensure an accurate stroke, a long, level follow through, and the habit of staying down to complete your shots, you should follow your tip through the cue ball to the spot. Keep your tip there, over the spot, and stay down until the cue



ball comes back to hit it. Make sure to strike the cue ball slightly above center, to produce natural roll, and use light-tomedium speed.

After you are hitting the first shot consistently you

can add an object ball to the exercise for warmup shot B. Place the object ball on the foot spot and the cue ball a diamond away at the spot marked X in the diagram. Shoot the object ball straight to the side rail with a stop shot so it rebounds straight back to hit the cue ball, which is waiting for it where they first made contact. That should be relatively simple, so work for absolute precision. When you hit the shot perfectly the rebounding object ball will hit the cue ball full and send it directly backwards to point Y in the diagram.

With the first two shots mastered you are ready to move on to big daddy, shot C. Start with the cue ball on the head spot and place an object ball on the spot in the exact center of the table. Begin with a longer version of shot B, shooting the object ball straight to the center of the foot rail with a stop shot. Shoot until the object ball is rebounding consistently straight back to hit the cue ball, which is waiting for it in the center of the table. The extra distance makes this shot somewhat more difficult than the shot across the

width of the table. As with shot B, look for the object ball to hit the cue ball full and send it back toward or over the head spot-a perfect hit.

Once that shot is mastered you can add a number of variables and sharpen your ability to find the center of the cue ball under different conditions. First add distance, and difficulty, by moving the object ball to the foot spot. Then it is time to experiment with draw and follow. With the object ball in the center of the table again, shoot a draw shot. If it's hit straight with pure draw, the cue ball comes straight back while the object ball returns to meet it somewhere behind the point where they first made contact. Then play the shot with follow to send the cue ball straight forward to meet the object ball on the line somewhere past the point of first contact. From there you can work with speed and hone your ability to hit the cue ball dead center and straight with harder and softer strokes.

To complete the exercise you can work with the most difficult variable, elevation. Move the cue ball back to within a few inches of the head rail and, with an elevated cue, repeat the shot beginning with the stop shot. Pay close attention to speed since elevation brings out a very strong impulse to shoot too hard. Begin with moderate elevation and proceed carefully as you move the cue ball closer to the head rail in small increments to increase the necessary elevation gradually. Can you make the shot with draw? When you can produce the desired, second collision in the center of table with an elevated cue your stroke rivals world-class.

As you work with this practice shot you will see how challenging it can be to hit the cue ball dead center and shoot it straight consistently. Something else you will observe is how the tiniest bit of english transfers to the object ball and throws it off line. Be patient with this shot and practice it with care. This is not an exercise to work through one time and then shelve. Even if it is not the perfect practice shot, keep it handy anyway to visit periodically throughout the years of your pool career and it will deliver a big payoff.

## Jeanette Lee and Barry Hearn Earn Enshrinement in Billiard Congress of America Hall of Fame

Broomfield, Colo., August 21, 2013 - The Billiard Congress of America Hall of Fame is honored to welcome two of pool's most mediasavvy personalities in 2013. The United States Billiard Media Association today announced that women's champion Jeanette "The Black Widow" Lee and British promoter Barry Hearn have earned induction into the sport's hall of fame by becoming the 61st and 62nd members.

Lee, 41, will enter the Greatest Players wing of the BCA Hall of Fame, while Hearn, 65, will be honored for Meritorious Service. Both will be formally inducted during ceremonies on December 2, 2013, at the Mirage Hotel/Casino in Las Vegas.

In the closest Hall of Fame voting ever, Lee edged Finnish star Mika Immonen in a special runoff election. The two champions were tied after the initial ballots were submitted. In the runoff, Lee and Immonen went head to head, where Lee surpassed her male contemporary by just two votes.

Born in Brooklyn, N.Y., Lee is unquestionably the most recognizable contemporary pool player



in the world. As a player, Lee's supreme confidence and drive took her to the Women's Professional Billiards Association's No. 1 ranking.

As a promoter and marketer, Lee parlayed her talent and looks into a small business empire that has resulted in untold amounts of exposure for both her and the sport. After boldly declaring her intention to become No. 1 in 1993, Lee wasted little time, winning three WPBA Classic Tour events, the U.S. Open 9-Ball Championship and the WPBA Nationals in 1994. The incredible string of wins vaulted Lee to No. 1 and earned her Player-of-the-Year honors from both Billiards Digest and Pool & Billiard Magazine. Lee won seven more Classic Tour titles from '95-'99, and added two EPSN titles, the Tournament of Champions and Ultimate Shootout. In 2001, Lee earned the gold medal at the World Games in Akita, Japan. She has won a dozen titles in the 2000s, including the WPBA Florida Classic and BCA Open Championship in 2004. Lee's accomplishments at the table are all the more impressive considering the physical ailments (scoliosis, arthritis, bursitis and more) that have resulted in 10 surgical procedures.

Off the table, Lee's contributions and clout have been recognized in her 1998 selection as WPBA Sportsperson of the Year and her ranking as one of the industry's most powerful people in the biannual Billiards Digest Power Poll in 2001, '03, '05 and '07. She was featured in ESPN The Magazine's annual "Body Issue," has been ranked among the world's sexiest female athletes, and

> has appeared in numerous television commercials and as a guest on countless national television shows. She has served as National Spokesperson for The Scoliosis Association and on the board of the Women's Sports Foundation.

> Born in London, Hearn began his professional career as an accountant. In the early '70s, Hearn bought sever-

al billiard halls around London, and then expanded into event promotion and television with the formation of Matchroom Sport.

In 1994 Hearn branched out into American pool, staging the Mosconi Cup, a Ryder Cupstyle 9-ball event pitting the top players from the U.S. against the best of Europe. For 20 years, the Mosconi Cup has been aired live and in its entirety throughout the UK, and as edited programing throughout Europe (and on occasion in the U.S. Since 1994) Hearn has also staged the World Pool Masters (20 consecutive years), the World Pool League/World Cup of Pool (1998-2013), and World Pool Championship (1999-2007).

\$9 million in prize money. Additionally, more than 800 hours of Matchroom events have been aired live throughout Europe and Asia, with thousands of additional hours of packaged programing being aired throughout the world. It could be argued that Hearn's efforts through Matchroom have played as important a role as anyone's in the development of international pool competition.

Voting for the 2013 BCA Hall of Fame was conducted by the USBMA Hall of Fame Board,

Incredibly, Matchroom events have never fea-

tured an entry fee, and have distributed nearly

Voting for the 2013 BCA Hall of Fame was conducted by the USBMA Hall of Fame Board, which consists of USBMA members, elected At -Large members and living members of the BCA Hall of Fame. Induction in the Greatest Players category is awarded to the player named on the most ballots. A second player is elected if both players are named on more than 70 percent of the ballots. To be eligible for consideration in the Greatest Players category, a player a) must be 40 years old by Jan. 1 of the year of their induction; b) must have a professional playing career of at least 10 years; and c) must have recorded significant achievements in U.S.-based events.

A special Meritorious Service Committee recommends a person or persons for consideration by the Hall of Fame Board. Induction into the Meritorious Service category is achieved if more than 50 percent of the Hall of Fame Board votes in favor of the candidate. Hearn received confirmation on 99 percent of the ballots.

Lee, in her second year of eligibility, and Immonen, in his first year of eligibility, were both named on 53 percent of the ballots in the initial voting. Germany's Oliver Ortmann was named on 28 percent of the ballots. Belinda Calhoun, Kim Davenport, Gerda Hofstatter, Mary Kenniston, Rodney Morris and Vivian Villarreal each received votes on less than 25 percent of the ballots. In the runoff election, Lee received 21 votes, while Immonen received 19.

## Day One

I got my shit together as best I could this morning.

I ooohed and aaahed over modern conveniences now available to participants such as being able to check brackets on nice big screens right next to the tournament desk. You could also sign up for text message notifications regarding the time and location of your next match, and your opponent's name.

I might have been a little ambitious/clueless when signing up for events this year. I entered a total of four events: scotch doubles 8-ball, singles 8-ball, team 8-ball, and team 9-ball. It seemed like a good idea at the time. I forgot how long it had been since I'd signed up for a full roster of events. No helping it now.

My first event was scotch doubles 8-ball. I hadn't had much time to practice lately with my partner (since he and his girlfriend had been traipsing all over some tropical paradise — no, I'm not jealous AT ALL) but, honestly, I didn't care. Dude was going to have to carry me and

since I didn't weigh too much, I figured things would be all right. We started off very shaky but managed to scramble through a couple of matches.

It was during one of these matches that I first encountered (for this tournament) the strange phenomenon of Why In The World Did You Say That. Now, you all know by now I like to play in silence. I'm not one for small talk or compliments. This is pool, mister (or misteress). Let's play the game. Silence is golden. Silence is neutral. Silence (aside from necessary exchanges regarding the game being played) is respectful to both competing parties. You win? You don't have to say anything to me. In fact, I prefer you don't. If I win? I felt like absolute shit for letting my partner down. As I walked back to sit down, one of my opponents looked at me and said, "Haha, you gave yourself the rack!"

Why In The World Did You Say That.

I make you laugh? You think I'm here to amuse you?

Aw, hell naw.

My opponent had served me a Pissed Off Royale with Cheese and now, I just... could not let these people win. Victory was not allowed for these two. Allowed to these two victory was not. They eventually missed (as the rack was a fustercluck), my partner made a shot and I was left with something tricky to shoot. I cracked my neck (terrifically bad habit) and nearly broke my teeth with the desire to get my game under control. I fired it in and set my partner up perfectly. In the span of an inning, my game changed completely. As I played better, my partner played better, too. At the risk of sounding wee, trite, and precious — it was like magic. Total voodoo magic. We won 4-3 playing some of the best pool we had ever played together.

Mark: Yes, take a break for at least a couple of weeks so when you return to the game you will miss it. Being refreshed will help you work through your slumps.

Hector Perez from Kansas City, KS asks: How lucky do you feel having a girlfriend who loves pool as much as you do?

Mark: I feel very fortunate to have Melissa in my life and it's a bonus that we both have the same passions. Thanks for asking Hector.

Chris Macey from Denver, CO asks: How did he develop that stroke?

Mark: Chris, my stroke just comes out naturally but I used to watch Buddy's stroke as a kid and now it's so much a part of my game.

Chris Macey from Denver, CO also asks: Who gives you the most competition?

Mark: Chris, ALL players give me competition because I try and play everyone the same way! Its not about them, its about me and the table.

Sharon Kay Hubbard from Franktown, CO asks: What do you like to do when warming up before a tournament?

Mark: Sharon, right before tournaments I only play about 2 hours per day verses 5 hours because I don't want to get burned out early in the tournament. The day of the event, I like to go in an hour prior to start time to get used to the speed of the table and let my stroke out!

Jennie Malloy from Chevy Chase, MD asks: Which is more stressful... shooting pool in an action match or shooting pool in a tournament setting?



Mark: Jennie, I have more pressure in a tournament setting because you only get to lose twice. If you're in a money game all you have to do is flip the coin and win or lose the match.

Jennie Malloy from Chevy Chase, MD also asks: If you are in action, do you shoot better on your own money or do you shoot better if you are being staked?

Mark: Jennie, I play better on my own money! It's less stressful than letting someone else down by losing.

Jennie Malloy from Chevy Chase, MD also asks: Would playing a left-handed player be a disadvantage to a right-handed player in their shot-selection, strategy and leaves?

Mark: Jennie, I don't think so... Plus it's not about them. It's about me taking them out of the picture and just playing the table.
