



Double-Kiss Game Winners

November 2010

For most of us the pool education progresses in roughly the same manner from our initial struggle with shot making to our first awareness of position play. Then through practice and play we learn to refine both foundational skills with a process we employ to sharpen those refinements for as long as we continue to play. And along the way, if we pay attention, we also assemble what might be called a bag of tricks, which contains shots that we usually don't figure out on our own but tend to learn from watching others play them. Many of those shots lie well within intermediate players' skills but outside of their vision until they first see them executed. That is one reason those who associate with and compete against the best players speed their improvement so much more dramatically than those players who are content to linger at the game's bottom tiers.



shooting at the 8 ball with no good shot or easy safety. And with the 9 hanging in the lower right corner we must look for an offensive opportunity to win the game. The first thought that would occur along those lines to most players would be an attempt to bank the 8 cross corner to knock in the 9 that's begging to be pocketed. However, in light of the positions of the cue ball and 8 ball, that shot is not an option because of the inevitable double kiss inherent in this setup.



And because these situations arise so infrequently most beginning and intermediate players are not likely to see the game winning opportunities that they offer.

In shot A we're



In the diagram we face two different 9-Ball setups with no good shot on the object ball. With the cue ball and 8 positioned even with each other as shown they would have to lie another foot or so away from the bottom rail for that bank to be a viable option. But, while the double kiss prevents the bank, it also offers an easy game winner if we alter our hit on the 8 ball. Instead of cutting the 8 ball as we would for the bank shot we're going hit it almost full and pocket the 9 with the cue ball. To make the shot, aim at the 8 very slightly left of a straight on hit with a little draw on the cue ball and moderate speed. The almost full hit on the frozen 8 will send the cue ball back along the line we see in the diagram to pocket the 9 ball for the game winner.

8-Ball: You don't have to get out now, just get out

As our pool game improves, so does our game plan. We discover how much more enjoyable it is when we win. We learn to shoot defensive shots. We realize that sometimes the first one to

attempt the run out may not always be the one who wins the game.

Eventually, we appreciate that in order to win more games, patience trumps pride. Sure, it feels great to break and run, but oftentimes tables are just not very run-friendly. We just have to accept that we don't need to get out in this inning. It's now that we ask ourselves, "Is it more important to win this game or to be the hero?"

You may have three shots in front of you that you can make, but if none of them help you break out that trouble ball, then QUIT RUNNING! Basic 8ball strategy tells us when we have one or more balls tied up, it is to our advantage to keep more traffic on the table. If you don't have a plan to get your guys out of jail, keep as many soldiers around as possible.

League or team play environments do not necessarily encourage to the smartest, game-winning

decisions. Far too often, during a team scenario, I've witnessed players go for the run out when it's nearly impossible. It's stuck in their mind that they must be the "hero." They don't want to let their teammates down. They must get the "points" and they must try to run out whenever they get to the table.

In many leagues, the more balls your opponent has left on the table, the higher you can score for that win. This scoring system only promotes super aggressive play. Instead of thinking, "How can I win this game?" their objective shifts to "How can I win this game now?" Many times, this mentality can backfire on them. When they force a run out that isn't there, true, sometimes they can get lucky, but very often they just clear all their balls out of the way and leave their opponents a back door run out. That's the worst thing they can do.

It's critical to analyze the table. Take a good look at where the balls are lying. Do you have more than one cluster to deal with? Do you have a way to address each of them? Are you confident you will make the shot that you're facing? Are you certain you'll have something to shoot at after your break out(s)? If you answered "no" or you're unsure of any of these questions, then you may want to consider ducking for now and running out later.

Think about lagging a ball in front of a pocket

and blocking it from your opponent. If you can't get out, make your opponent have to work for it. Play a safety where you can also bank one of your balls down by the trouble. Position your balls on the table so they are in your favor. Get them ready for you to take advantage later. Lock up safeties that can get you ball in hand are much easier to play when you have more balls on the table to hide behind.

Remember, if you can't get out now, don't. If you can't run out now, position your balls and run out later. A win is a win whether it happens now or later.

Tokoph Stops Challenge by Haddad to Claim Midwest 9-Ball Tour Stop

Tommy Tokoph stopped a strong, one-loss side challenge by Mark Haddad to complete an undefeated, September 25-26 weekend on the Midwest 9-Ball Tour. The \$2,600-added event drew 52 entrants to Billiards Ink in Englewood, CO.

From among the winners' side final four, Tokoph sent Ron Lincoln to the one-loss side 9-5, as Chuey Rivera was doing likewise to Tony Piazza, by the same score. Tokoph gained the hot seat with a 9-2 win over Rivera, and watched as Haddad clawed his way back to the finals.

Haddad, in the meantime, was in the midst of a seven-match winning streak that had begun when Ed Borrego sent him west in the event's third round (Haddad had received a bye in the opening round). Haddad moved into the 9-12 money round, where he defeated Mike Hellmer 9-6, and then Neal Morrison 9-5 to pick up Lincoln. Piazza was met by Gomez, who'd survived two straight double hill matches against Ruben Silva and Sam Cordoba. Haddad dominated 9-1 against Lincoln, moving into the quarterfinals against Piazza, who'd defeated Gomez in a double hill battle.

Piazza came within a game of forcing a second straight, and third overall double hill match for himself, but Haddad prevailed 9-7 and moved into the semifinals against Rivera. In what would prove to be his final win, Haddad persevered in another double hill match, and with Rivera in the rearview mirror, he turned to face Tokoph. Tokoph made a second set in the true double elimination final format unnecessary, defeating Haddad 9-4 to complete his undefeated weekend.

Question:

"Lately I've been putting in a lot of table time and I feel as though I'm shooting some of the best pool of my life, but in competition when it really counts, I've been missing the key shot to my run out. I literally can't seem to control my nerves. I would appreciate any advice you can give on this part of the mental game."

Answer:

Sorry to say but there is no quick fix for developing mental toughness. Each day that you practice you should be preparing for that big moment. Your objective for practice should be to work on problem shots or areas of your game that you need to be improved upon.

I suggest you participate in as many competitions as possible – over time your tournament game will improve... its called becoming "seasoned". Anytime you can feel pressure is a good thing.

My long time coach Henry would say its okay to feel nervous, it means that you're alive. Everyone gets nervous, I mean everyone!! It's how you handle the pressure that matters.

Stay in the present. Being present and not thinking of the past/future when you're at the table. It is a discipline and it's a part of the game that everyone needs to spend some time on.



Letter from a Cue Times reader:

Because It's the Right Thing To Do!

I am writing this letter to offer some suggestions to our pool community so that we can improve the tournament experience for all. We need to come together. I love all games of the sport and would love to see it grow. The following are my thoughts on the matter.

Tournament directors should -

A) Have a plan before players arrive to enter the tournaments.

Bar owners should -

A) Greet all players in attendance and make them feel welcome in their facilities.

B) No favoritism should be displayed, it creates distrust. C) Please hold all tournaments on different dates so that all can reap the benefits. Respect is very important.D) Hire the best directors you can find, someone who is firm, fair and consistent with players and bar owners.

Players should -

A) Support all tournaments not just their favorite location.

B) Show up on time to tournament postings.

C) Should conduct themselves in a respectful manner.D) Do not try to sneak around the handicap system.The whole purpose of this system is to create more business and competition

E) Do not complain.

F) Eat and drink at designated locations to help promote money added at a profit for each owner.

If we all take action and participate in every facet of my suggestions, we could have one of the best organizations in the country. Some of the best players in the country live and play in Colorado. Have fun because it's the right thing to do.





Friends and Family Gather to Pay Tribute to Stub Foley

In 1923, Bernard 'Stub' Foley began a lifelong hobby at age 8 when he discovered a pool table at his neighbor's house in rural Kansas. Stopping only for a fouryear stint in the Army, in which he served during World War II in New Guinea and the Philippines, (where there were no pool tables), Foley has traveled around the country mastering his hobby for the last 87 years.

In 2005, at the age of 89, Foley won the C Division of the Colorado State Singles Tournament, and he was inducted into the Valley National 8-Ball Association's (VNEA) International Hall of Fame in Las Vegas in May of this year.


"He's still one of Denver's better players," said Tony Brown, of Northglenn, who has known Foley for 45 years. "The man is 95 years old, and he'll whip your tail!"

Brown and more than 75 of Foley's friends, family members and fellow pool players gathered at Charlie's Billiards in Northglenn on Friday, October 22nd to pay tribute to Foley. Foley was escorted by limousine and was greeted outside by about 20 cheering fans as he walked into the packed pool hall with his cane.

"This is for his benefit," said Bob Garcia, manager of Charlie's Billiards, which hosted the "Tribute to Stub Foley Eight Ball Tournament," in which 42 of the top players from across Denver signed up. "He's a great guy. We call him 'The Angel on the Earth.""

Until recently, Stub had been quite ill. But after learning about the tribute in his honor, he did a 180 degree turn and not only made the tribute, he walked in under his own power! He refused a wheelchair and was given a long standing ovation upon his entry into Charlie's Billiards.

hanging over the bar, Garcia held a microphone as Foley thanked everyone for coming. "You'll never know how much this means to me," said Foley, who raised eight kids and has

lived in Northglenn since 1966. "You don't realize how many friends you have until something happens to you and they come by to wish you well. I want to thank you all for coming out tonight."

Up until two months ago, Foley had been healthy and active, even playing the fiddle onstage for two hours at his 95th birthday party in August. However, Foley has congestive heart failure and has been pretty sick lately, said his grandson, Patrick Stephens, who lives with Foley. "He's day to day. He could go anytime," he said. Foley's granddaughter, Jen Gregg, flew in from Redwood City, Calif., for the event and said she didn't know if he would be able to walk inside, but added that's how he got

> his nickname - for being stubborn. "He has the biggest heart of anyone on this planet," she said. "Everyone will tell you that, it's his defining feature. That's why it's so ironic he has heart failure."

tester and a phone salesman, said his youngest daughter, Gail Palone, of Bennett. He said he was honored to be inducted into the VNEA's Hall of Fame, where he received a standing ovation from more than 3,000 people. "It's the greatest feeling that you couldn't even explain," he said.

Stephenson added, "I've never seen him so proud in my whole life. It was an amazing experience for him."

Bruce Ryan, 61, of Northglenn, who has traveled with Foley in a league called "The Old Timers" for years, said Foley is one of a kind.

"You'll never find another one like him," he said. "This packed pool hall is a testament to him, all from word of

mouth. I'm just waiting for him to come back, I hope."







Shot B is a little more difficult but a lot more fun. Here we're shooting at the 7 ball with no good shot and the 8 ball blocking a standard rail dribble to the 9. Again the double kiss prevents banking the 7 back to the lower left corner, but also again we can employ the double kiss to win the game. To pocket the 9 ball as shown aim to hit the 7 ball slightly right of straight on with follow on the cue ball. If the cue ball runs into the 8 you're cutting the 7 too thin. If it rebounds straight back with no turn toward the 9 you're hitting it too full. A perfect hit on the 7 will bounce the cue ball backwards enough to get around the 8 before the top spin grabs and sends the cue ball along the path we see for another game winner. When first attempting this shot most players hit it way too hard and miss wide since too much speed prevents the cue ball from changing direction in

time. The shot requires an accurate hit on the 7 ball with follow and moderate speed.

Neither shot is difficult to learn and execute but, because neither can be considered ordinary, they will some require practice to marry the variables of aim and speed for consistent and confident execution. Dr. Dave and I had a lot of fun filming these shots for the *Video Encyclopedia of Pool Shots* where these two and another dozen or so more creative double-kiss examples turn up on Disc IV.

Ortmann Wins The World Tournament: Becomes Historic 3x World Champion

Oliver Ortmann has made history once again. Germany's Ortmann cemented his pool legacy with a sound victory over World #1 Mika Immonen of Finland. This is his third World Championship title, which is a new record for Europeans. Previously only Mika Immonen (Finland) and Thorsten Hohmann (Germany) held two World Championship belts aside from Ortmann. The only other man to win three World Championships sanctioned by the WPA is USA's Earl Strickland. The Predator World Tournament of 14.1 was produced by Dragon Promotions and hosted by Breaker Billiards and owner Ricky Coren. This is the 70th edition of the straight pool event, making it the world's oldest tournament.



The World Tournament was played on beautiful Brunswick Gold Crown tables and using Simonis Cloth. The event started play on October 6,2010 and ended on October 11th. The greatest straight pool players from around the world arrived on USA's east coast again to New Jersey, and was vying in this prestigious event to win the coveted title of World Straight Pool Champion. The event was co-sponsored by Amsterdam Billiard Club, Master Chalk, Aramith Balls, www.Ultimate10ball.com, and Accu-Stats.

Earlier in the day, Ortmann defeated Netherland's Huidji See in the semi-finals 200 to 126. It was not a pretty match as neither player could get on a long run. Huidji had previously lost to Ortmann in the finals of the 2007 World Tournament. In the other semi-finals, Immonen cruised over former World 14.1 Champion Thorsten Hohmann 200 to 65. This would be Immonen's second consecutive finals at The World Tournament, and missed a break shot, but missed a lukewarm difficult shot and was sent back to the chair. Ortmann charged an even higher price with a 102 ball run and needed only 16 balls to win the match. Fortunatley for Immonen, Ortmann missed and gave Immonen another chance.

Immonen faced the prospect of losing 200-0 in the finals, but then came with his own run but was stopped short on a miss at 66. Ortmann ran the rack and in the final rack Immonen threw in his towel conceding the match to the new World Champion.

Ortmann covered his face with his hands in a sea

of emotion. He walked back to his chair and tried to wipe the tears from his eyes.

"Oliver is a champion. I even admitted before the match, that I think he is the greatest straight pool player in the world", said Immonen in his speech. he added humorously, "Maybe I jinxed myself!"

One of the event's promoters, Charlie Williams, made the final announcements and closing remarks from the finalists. Williams announced that this event was even more special because Ortmann's mother had been diagnosed with cancer, and this burden laid heavy on Ortmann's heart during the week. Ortmann had just finished his weeping, then lightly threw a towel at Williams as he became overwhelm with tears and emotion again.

"As Charlie was saying, this World Championans. He was the first European to come over and make noise internationally with his win at the US Open 14 years ago, and now he completes a circle with a historic third World Championship. No doubt, he is one of the greatest ever. He deserves to be in the Hall of Fame", said Williams.

How will this event impact Oliver's life?

"My mom's a real fighter. I guess that's where my killer instinct comes from. She told me you've done your job, and now I will do mine and beat this thing. I really wanted to win for her this week, to give her positive energy and hope."

Jasmin Clenches Women's World 10-Ball Championship

Trailing 4-0 to Korea's monster Ga Young Kim, Jasmin Ouschan could feel the World Championship slipping away. But the determined young Austrian, backed by a vocal crowd of Jasmin fans, turned the tide and fought back to win the match and her first ever World Championship win. This was the conclusion of the 5 day Yalin Women's World 10-Ball Championship that drew



forty-eight of the world's best women in billiards.

In the first semi-finals, home country favorite Rubilen Amit was looking like she might be destined to defend her crown successfully at the World 10-Ball. But Korea's powerhouse Ga Young Kim came out too strong and led 4-0 before Amit even had a chance to play. Amit finally scored a game to the delight of the crowd at 4-1, but then missed an easy 8-ball that further pushed Kim to her goal. Amit made one last surge when down 6-1 to come back to 6-5, but then Kim turned up the notch and finished the match at 9-6 to enter her 4th World Championship finals.

In the second semi-finals, England's Kelly Fisher and Austria's Ouschan were both on the hunt for their first World Championship win. But Ouschan was the one who came out strong first while Fisher looked completely lost in her game. Capitalizing on every mistake Fisher would make, Ouschan built a seemingly insurmountable 7-2 lead with only 2 games away from her first ever finals of a World Championship. But Fisher scraped her way one game at a time, and soon Ouschan was the one leaving opportunities as Fisher won the next 5 straight games. At 7-7, Fisher made a bad error in a strategic push, and gave Ouschan the out to lead 8-7. In the next game, it was Ouschan who faltered and gave Fisher control again. Fisher would tie the match at 8-8 and for a final game, but she made the 9-ball and scratched making the cueball as well giving Ouschan an easy 10-ball for the win. Ouschan looked up to the sky seemingly as if to say what did I do to deserve this gift, and then moved on to the finals.

"You kind of hate to win that way when your opponent hands you the win, but what can you do", said Michael Neumann, Ouschan's lifelong coach since she was a child.

In the final match, Ouschan only had moments to recover from her traumatic win before facing her biggest challenge of the event in Ga Young Kim. Kim had previously won two World Championships in 9-Ball, but was looking for her first in 10-Ball, which is widely regarded as a much more skillful game than 9-Ball. Kim had also just recently beat Ouschan just one week earlier in the USA in the finals of an ESPN championship event.

Kim looked like she would run away with the match as she quickly built a 4-0 lead. Ouschan then stopped the bleeding and

ran out off a bad safety by Kim and then broke and ran two racks in a row. Kim then started a series of missed shots and mistakes and gave new life to Ouschan and Jasmin ended up winning a total of 7 straight games to turn the tide over her Korea nemesis. At 7-4, Kim finally made some great shots including a long cut on the 10-ball to close to 7-5. But a mistake in the next rack again pushed Jasmin back to 8-5. At 9-6, Kim made her final error with a botched safety attempt on the 3ball, and Ouschan started her final run for the win. As she came to the final 10-ball, tears in her eyes and a wave of emotion could be visibly seen on her face. As the final 10ball was pocketed, Ouschan let out a yell and a mountain of emotions poured out of her slim frame.

"I can't believe I won this event, especially in front of my favorite fans in the billiard capital of the world. I just want to thank Michael for coaching me and Dragon Promotions for organizing this great event. It's going to take me a few hours still for this to all sink in and hit me", said Ouschan tearful in her championship speech.

"She's won this event so early in her career, she's only 24 years old. I'm just worried to keep giving her goals to achieve", said Neumann.

Ouschan previously had swept all four of the European Championships for women, won several tour stops in the USA, and a World Games gold medal. But this win by far exceeds all other of her accomplishments. Jasmin will be able to enjoy being called The World Champion for the next several months.



Englishman Darren Appleton Wins the 2010 US Open


It all came down to the slow roll of an 8-ball, which broke out of the match's 28th rack, made its way to a corner pocket, paused to consider its fate and then, just did drop into the hole. And with that, Darren Appleton of Pomty, England, completed a run of nine straight matches to go undefeated through a field of 256 on hand for the 35th Annual US Open-9 Ball Championships. He became the first British citizen to win the title. The \$50,000-added event was once again, for the 14th straight year, held at the Chesapeake Convention Center from October 17-23.

Appleton's trail to the finals began on Sunday, October 17th with an 11-5 victory over Ronald Tutein. Over the course of the event's six days, he would play a total of 154 games, winning almost 60% of them (91). He gave up, on average, only seven racks per match. His nine-match winning streak included two wins over Deuel, as well as victories over Israeli champion Zion Zvi (11-8), Ronnie Alcano (11-7), Efren Reyes (11-5), and David Alcaide (11-8). In the battle for the hot seat, he defeated two-time defending champion, Mika Immonen 11-9.

Deuel came into the finals having won five matches in both brackets, defeating, among others, Keith Bennett (11-5), Shane Van Boening (11-8), Rodney Morris (11-9), Jason Klatt (11-1), and in the semifinals, Mika Immonen 11-3. He defeated Warren Kiamco twice, once in each bracket. He defeated him in a double hill battle in the fifth round on the winners' side and defeated him with the event's new 'win by two' rules in the quarterfinals. It was Appleton who sent him to the one-loss side in the sixth round 11-8, and Appleton who denied him his second US Open title with a thrilling 14-12 victory in the finals.

"It all came down to the breaks," said Deuel at the conclusion of the match. "I broke twice to keep it alive, and on his last break, the 8-ball just rolled in there.

"I made a few outs to keep myself in it," he added, "but hats off to him."



The two battled back and forth to a 4-4 tie, at which point, Appleton strung together four in a row to take what was looking to be a commanding lead at 8-4. Deuel came back to win two,

including a breakand-run rack that made it 8-6. One of Deuel's dry breaks then gave Appleton the opportunity to go up by three again. In the 16th rack, the pace slowed a bit, as the two of them played safe, seven times with the 1-ball, before Appleton broke the string of safeties. He got all the way to the 5-ball, and then scratched, to give Deuel ball in hand. Deuel ran out to narrow Appleton's lead to two at 9-7.

error by Appleton to make it 11-10 and then broke and ran to tie the score for the first time since the eighth game. He took the lead in the next rack, for the first time since the seventh game, with his second straight break and run.

Another dry break for Deuel knotted things at 12, and with a break and run of his own, Appleton won the game that would normally have ended the contest. But with the 'ahead by two' rule in play, Deuel got a chance at redemption and took advantage to tie the match at 13-13.

Deuel then recorded his second scratch of the match; this one on the break, and it was 'advantage' Appleton, 14-13, moving into the 28th game. It came down, in that final game, to that slow-rolling 8-ball. With the table layout at hand, had it stayed out, Deuel would likely have run the table and tied the match at 14. But that 8-ball did drop and Appleton ran the table to complete his undefeated week at the US Open.

Amidst great fanfare at the Accu-Stat broadcast table, founder and promoter Barry Behrman handed Appleton his mock oversize check for \$40,000, the event trophy and a gold Delta-13 rack. Deuel pocketed \$15,000 for his second place finish, while Mika Immonen took home \$10,000 for third place.

"I have a lot of respect for (Deuel's) game," Appleton said, "and I knew that if I was to going win it, I was going to have to pot a few balls.

"It was a great event," he added. "I wanted it badly, and I stayed patient."

Reflecting Deuel's assessment of the match, between the two of them, the match featured seven break-and-runs; four by Deuel. Deuel, though, was also on the 'winning' side of a dubious honor; of the seven times they broke dry, Deuel recorded seven of those.

Appleton committed one of his six unforced errors in the match in game 17, Deuel ran out and it was a single game lead for Appleton. Appleton won, Deuel responded, and it was 10-9. Appleton won the 20th game for an 11-9 lead, but Deuel took advantage of another unforced
